NAVAL RECRUITING PARTY WILL VISIT KLAMATH APRIL 25

A traveling naval recruiting party, consisting of three men from the U. S. navy recruiting station at Portland, will visit the city of Klamath Falls on April 25 and 26, according to an announcement made today by Lieutenant Commander L. B. Stuart, navy recruiting officer for the Portland district, through Chief Yeoman F. W. Paulson, U. S. navy, of Portland, who is in the city today arranging details in connection with the party's visit. The recruiting party is making a tour of some of the principal cities of Oregon for the purpose of accepting the applications and making physical and mental examinations of young men for enlistment in the U. S. navy. They will also appear before clubs, civic and patriotic organizations, schools, or other interested groups, to disseminate information on naval subjects and to exhibit sound motion pictures of various phases of navy life and activities.

During their stay in Klamath Falls, the party which will be composed of Chief Watertender John Sharpe, U. S. navy, recruiter in charge, Chief Yeoman William T. Hardy, USFR speaker, and Chief Pharmacist's Mate Edward "R" Gibson, USFR medical examiner, will make their headquarters at Postoffice building.

Young men interested are urged to investigate the opportunities offered by the United States navy.

OSC INDEPENDENTS LEAVE NOMINATING TO GREEK GROUPS

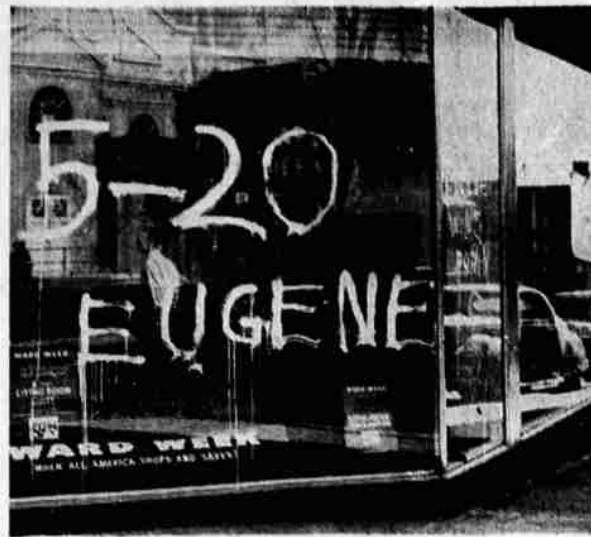
CORVALLIS, April 18 (AP)—Unaffiliated students at Oregon State college ignored the annual nominating assembly and left the glory of student body political offices to sorority and fraternity members.
