French reports at between 3000 and 4000 men.)

For weeks, the German press in dealing with Narvik wrote of it as unimportant in the Norwegian developments.

In private talks, sources usually well informed intimated that Hitler would soon give orders to the bottled-up Germans in the ore port and its vicinity to retreat strategically to the Swedish border if necessary and let themselves be interned in Sweden.

That Germany now regarded Narvik again as of major importance is also indicated by the fact that power divers went directly from Namsos, after they were reported to have sunk a battleship of the Queen Elizabeth class and a heavy cruiser, to Narvik to do their stuff there.

Hitler apparently has decided he must make doubly sure of remaining in possession of Narvik as the western outlet port for ore from the Swedish Kiruna mines.

At the same time authorized sources kept warning that all talk about the Mediterranean might be a blind and that the alleged British plans really are focussed elsewhere.

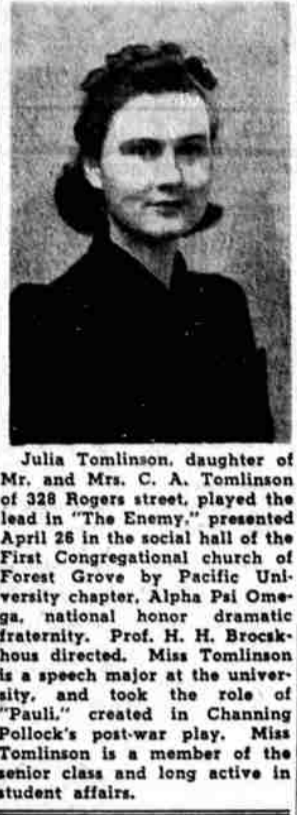

battle fleet, now based at Alexandria.

7—A new spy scare in Hungary, resulting in the arrest of 200 persons suspected of working for both France and Russia.

Two border incidents involving Italian and Yugoslav forces—both a week ago—and the heavy reinforcements of Italian troops on the Yugoslav frontier were reported in Ljubljana, Yugoslavia. Yugoslav military quarters estimated Italy now has more than 300,000 men massed north of Fiume.

One Italian soldier was killed and three seriously wounded when a fascist troop patrol attempted to disarm a Yugoslav sergeant on Yugoslav territory near Fume in one border incident, Yugoslavs asserted.

In the second reported incident, Yugoslav anti-aircraft batteries shot down an Italian observation plane at Bakar, near Fiume. Yugoslavs fished out the plane and charged its pilot, who drowned, had been photographing defense works.

Uneasiness was manifest throughout the southeastern capitals, in a state of high tension for weeks past, and many diplomats, including United States officials, sent pessimistic reports to their governments.

Any boy is eligible for membership (1) who is a resident of the United States, (2) who is qualified and legally authorized to drive a car in his home state, (3) who is at least 14 years of age, (4) whose 19th birthday is not earlier than August 29, 1940. The make of car owned or driven by an entrant or his family does not matter. The League is for all boys eligible under the four requirements stated above.

To enroll for membership all you need to do is fill out, sign and mail an official Enrollment Blank to the Ford Good Drivers League, Dearborn, Michigan. Blanks may be obtained from Ford, Mercury or Lincoln-Zephyr automobile dealers anywhere. If you have any difficulty getting one in this way, please write the League, and Enrollment Blank will be sent to you.

This will be a notable occasion. Each of the winners from the 48 States will arrive in New York with his sponsor in time for the

registration Monday forenoon, August 26. They may travel to New York either by train or automobile. In either case, an amount equal to train fare and pullman both ways, plus an allowance for meals, will be paid by the League for both contestant and one sponsor. In New York, both will be guests of the League for five days.

On the afternoon of August 26 there will be a parade of State Champions. Cars for this and final driving tests will be furnished by the League.

On Tuesday and Wednesday the Contest Finals will be held. Contestants will be scored by driving experts, directed by the Board of Judges, on:

- Day and night driving.
- Maneuver operations, such as parking, braking, backing, clutching, etc.
- Physical reaction tests, including vision.

Upon the results of these practical tests, the judges will select the National Champion and Runner-up and will award all scholarship prizes.

THE BANQUET OF CHAMPIONS

On Thursday evening, August 29, awards will be announced at the League's First Championship Banquet in New York City. Edsel Ford, President of the League, and members of the Honorary Board are scheduled to be present.

On Friday there will be a visit to Radio City for all contestants and their sponsors, a luncheon with prominent sports stars as guests, a big league baseball game, and a visit to the World's Fair at night.
