

MEDICOS FROM KLAMATH WILL ATTEND MEET

ASHLAND — Physicians and surgeons of Douglas, Josephine, Jackson, Coos, Klamath and Lake counties will come to Ashland Tuesday, May 14, for annual all-day meeting of the Southern Oregon Medical society.

The gathering will be the 40th annual session, and will feature election of officers for 1940-1941 terms. All meetings and the noon luncheon will be held at the Ashland Elks temple.

President Charles A. Haines of this city will have an important part in the morning session, which also will feature an address of welcome by Professor Irving Vining of the old Southern Oregon Normal school. Election, selection of next year's meeting place, communications and consideration of applications for membership will occupy the medics until noon.

Included among the scientific papers slated for discussion will be "Examination, Diagnosis and Treatment of the Diarrheas," by Dr. Banner R. Brooke of Portland, "The Program of the Oregon State Medical Society," by Dr. Charles E. Hunt, president of the state society, Eugene, and "The Diagnostic Value of Certain Cutaneous Symptoms," by Dr. Lyle B. Kingery, Portland.

Other papers to be read will be "The Problem of Atherosclerosis and Atherosclerotic Heart Disease," by Dr. Noble Wiley Jones, Portland, and "Biliary Tract Surgery," by Dr. Eugene Rockey, Portland.

Discussions will be opened by Dr. Dwight H. Findley and Dr. L. D. Inakeep, Medford, Dr. Harvey A. Woods, Ashland, and Dr. E. D. Lamb, Klamath Falls.

Connecticut Newspaper Wins Pulitzer Award for 1939

NEW YORK, May 8 (AP)—The Waterbury, Conn. (Republican) and American today was awarded a \$500 Pulitzer prize gold medal for the most disinterested and meritorious service rendered by an American newspaper during 1939.

The award was made for the newspaper's campaign exposing municipal graft.

The San Francisco Chronicle received honorable mention for "its part in settling the waterfront and warehouse strike in San Francisco June 22 to December 1, 1939."

For distinguished service as a foreign or Washington correspondent during the war . . . \$500, awarded to Otto D. Tolischus, of the New York Times for his dispatches from Berlin.

Honorable mention was given to Lloyd Lebras of the Associated Press for his dispatches from Warsaw, Bucharest and Ankara.

For distinguished editorial writing during the year, limited to the editorial page . . . \$500, awarded to Bart Howard, of the St. Louis Post-Dispatch.

For distinguished example of a reporter's work during the year, \$1000 awarded to S. Burton Heath, of the New York World-Telegram for his expose of the frauds perpetrated by Federal Judge Martin T. Manton.

For a distinguished example of a cartoonist's work published in an American newspaper during the year, \$500, awarded to Edmund Duffy, of the Baltimore Sun, for the cartoon entitled "The Outstretched Hand," published October 7, 1939.

Prizes in letters: For a distinguished novel published during the year by an

American author, preferably dealing with American life, \$1000 awarded to "The Grapes of Wrath" by John Steinbeck.

For a distinguished book of the year upon the history of the United States, \$1000, awarded to "Abraham Lincoln: The War Years" by Carl Sandburg.

For a distinguished American biography teaching patriotic and unselfish services to the people, illustrated by an eminent example, excluding as too obvious the names of George Washington and Abraham Lincoln, \$1000 awarded to "Woodrow Wilson. Life and Letters" by Ray Stannard Baker; volumes seven and eight.

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
