

MOTHER'S DAY PROGRAM SET FOR ARMORY

The principal speaker at the Mother's day exercises of the Klamath Falls aerie and auxiliary of the Fraternal Order of Eagles will be David R. Vandenberg, prominent member of the fraternity. The public is invited to the exercises which will be held Sunday, May 12, in the armory at 2 p. m., announced M. L. Bratton, secretary of the local aerie.

The event is sponsored by the FOE with several other civic and fraternal organizations taking part.

"In a very special sense, Mother's day belongs primarily to the Eagles," declared Secretary Bratton. "The inspiration came from within our own ranks. Thirty-six years ago Frank E. Hering, a leader of the order, made the first known public plea for the national observance of a day to honor mothers. He has been officially recognized as the 'Father of Mother's day' by the American War Mothers."

In 1912 the grand aerie passed a resolution making it mandatory for every aerie to observe Mother's day. It was not until two years later that congress set aside the second Sunday in May as Mother's day.

The committee in charge of the Sunday exercises includes M. L. Shepherd, G. C. Persell, Don Forest, M. L. Bratton and Robert M. Book of the local aerie; Maudie Larson, Stella M. WOOL GROWERS TO ATTEND SHOW AT TREASURE ISLAND

SAN FRANCISCO, May 9.—All wool growers and their friends are cordially invited to attend the California sheep exposition, wool show and sheep dog trials to be held at the state fair grounds, Sacramento, on Tuesday and Wednesday, May 21 and 22, informs W. P. Wing, secretary of the California Wool Growers association, under whose management these stellar events in western sheep circles are held each year. The sheep show will mark the 20th anniversary of the establishment of this great sheep and wool exhibit and ram sale. An innovation this year will be the second annual far western sheep dog trials, the first trials of which created such wide interest at Treasure Island last fall.

With more rams and ewes on hand as compared with any previous California sale, and with better quality rams and purebred ewes offered for inspection, preparations are being made for a larger number of sheepmen in attendance. At last year's ram sale there were sheepmen present from every western sheep state including Texas, New Mexico, Montana, Idaho, Washington, Oregon, Utah, Wyoming, Colorado, Arizona and Nevada; while Canada and Costa Rica also were represented.

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CATCH CARDS SHOW FISHING EXCELLENT

Fishing is exceptional, better than it has been in years, in numerous streams and lakes of Oregon, according to information contained on catch report cards received by the Oregon state game commission from anglers.

For the first time in history, the game commission has distributed catch report cards among sportsmen, requesting them to fill out such cards with information concerning fishing and a heavy return has been made thus far.

Excellent catches of rainbow trout have been reported on the Deschutes river and on the upper Deschutes above Bend. The catches have also included eastern brook and some loch levent trout.

Many anglers have met with success on the McKenzie river and the report cards show fine fishing on the Siuslaw, Nestucca and Metolius rivers.

Enthusiastic reports have been brought back from Paulina, Suttle and East lakes, which opened on May 1. Most of the anglers returned with limit catches of trout from these bodies of waters. Equally good reports also came from anglers who fished on North Twin lake.

Fishermen reporting to the game commission seem unanimous in the opinion that angling in these rivers and lakes is far better than it has been in years and all seemed particularly pleased at such good results so early in the season.
