

Mills Trackmen Win City Grade School Trophy

With almost ideal weather conditions prevailing several outstanding performances were turned in at the annual city elementary school track meet at Modoc field Saturday. Mills school scored the largest number of points during the afternoon and will have Rotary trophy in their display case for the coming year. The combined efforts of their "A", "B" and "C" athletes netted them 59 points. Fremont was next in the scoring with exactly half that number at 29, followed by Riverside with 22, Fairview 19, Pelican 16, Roosevelt 15 and Conger 4.

Among the outstanding performances of the day were a leap of 18 feet 5 1/2 inches by Schortgen of Mills in the "A" broad jump, and 8.7 seconds in the 75-yard dash by Johnson of Fremont, a jump of 4 feet 6 inches in the "B" class high jump by Lon Sanders and Harvey Teal as they tied for top honors.

The only record to fall in the meet was the baseball throw for "C" class boys. Brower of Mills bettered his own mark by throwing the ball 163 feet 8 inches, almost 20 feet over the mark he set last year.

All marks and times were far superior to those of the past two or three meets with one or two exceptions. The summaries:
