MARINE CORPS TO ACCEPT RECRUITS DURING JUNE

The United States marine corps recruiting office in the U. S. courthouse at Portland has been authorized to accept an unlimited number of men for enlistment during the month of June, according to word received today from Captain James B. Hardies, officer in charge of marine corps recruiting activities in the Portland district.

This, Captain Hardies stated, is due to the fact that congress has authorized the expansion of the marine corps to 34,000 enlisted men, its greatest peace time strength. Due to this great increase, promotion will be faster than it has been at any time during the past twenty years, the captain said.

Branch recruiting offices are being opened at Boise, Ida., and Walla Walla, Wash., to help in handling the increase.

Male United States citizens between the ages of 18 and 30, without dependents, of good habits and character, and in good health, are eligible for enlistment.

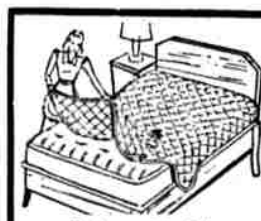
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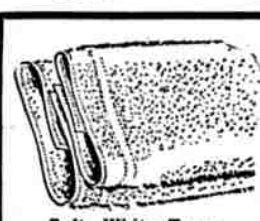
