

CANADA LESS AGOG THAN U. S. ON WAR

SAN FRANCISCO, June 6 (AP)—Nelson E. Grace, American manager of Noorduyn Aviation Ltd., of Montreal, Que., Wednesday said there is less war talk and less war hysteria in Canada than in the United States.

Grace, who has been inspecting the North American airplane factory at Inglewood, Calif., will leave here Thursday to start production on North America's Harvard 68 training planes at his factory in Montreal. He arrived here today by airliner from Los Angeles.

"Canadians take the war seriously but they just won't talk about it," said Grace. "I had to come to this country to hear the rumor that the seat of the British government might, in event of German victory, be moved to this hemisphere."

"The newspapers are censored slightly but generally speaking they get the same news there that you do in this country."

JAPAN KEEPS EYE ON U. S. NAVY IN ASIATIC REGION

TOKYO, June 6 (AP)—A spokesman for the Japanese admiralty today described the situation in the south Pacific as "abnormal" as a result of concentration of the United States navy at Hawaii and as a result of reports that new transfers would replace the United States complement at the Philippines with a larger force.

Announcement on May 7 that the United States fleet would remain in Hawaii after maneuvers there, instead of proceeding to California as scheduled, created widespread comment. On May 30 it was announced that the Hawaiian detachment, of 30 warships, had been incorporated in the United States fleet, indicating it would not return to California. There has been no announcement in Washington of an increased force for the Philippines.

UNEMPLOYMENT BENEFITS DROP 22 PER CENT

SALEM, Ore., June 6 (UP)—The Oregon unemployment compensation commission Wednesday reported a drop of 22 per cent in unemployment benefits in May compared with April, with a new high of \$604 job placements during the last week.

Unemployment checks for May totaled \$388,508 compared with \$499,321 for the previous month. The active file of unemployed dropped from 47,628 to 43,072, against 55,976 last year.

New jobs included: 2578 in berry fields of the Portland district; 463 in beet fields of eastern Oregon, near Ontario; Albany, 458 placements; Salem, 389; Oregon City, 315; Eugene, 228 and McMinnville, 153.

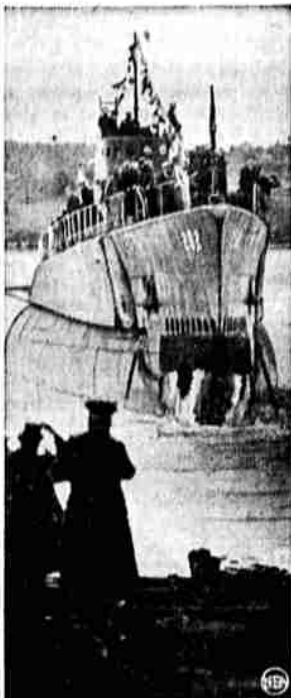

Senators Suggest Delay in Writing GOP War Policy

WASHINGTON, June 6 (AP)—Several senate republicans suggested Tuesday that fast-moving developments in Europe make it advisable to defer writing a foreign policy plank at the national convention until the remainder of the platform has been drafted.

Most republicans, they said, were more or less agreed on a strong "keep out of war" and increased defense declaration.

But they contended that specific language covering, for example, American assistance to the allies or territorial limits of United States defense policies—if such angles are to be touched on—must await conditions at the time the platform is ready for submission.

The platform committee, which will meet a week in advance of the June 24 convention to start preliminary discussions, is about three-fourths complete. Each state and territory will have one member.

SEWING UNIT FORMED FOR RED CROSS AT ALGOMA

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Invasion of Britain Claimed Foolhardy Until Air Cleared

NEW YORK, June 6 (UP)—Major Alexander P. De Seversky, American aircraft builder and speed flier, said last night a German invasion of England cannot be accomplished in the next few months and may be staved off long enough to permit the allies to erect impregnable defenses.

Regarding current "panic" that Germany will invade England, Seversky, who has a

wooden leg as a World war souvenir, observed that "we always swing in hysteria like a pendulum."

"When Germany started to attack Norway," he recalled, "it was obvious no naval force could have blocked the German conquest of that country, and yet a lot of people felt the German escapade would be an awful flop—they felt it would be impossible for the Germans to

carry troops through the Skagerrak because of the superiority of the British naval forces."

Seversky speaks with authority because during the World war he commanded the imperial Russian navy's Baltic pursuit squadron.

"But students of aerial warfare," he continued, "realize that if anyone has command of the air over land or sea nothing can be done in defense against such a power until the air is cleared. That was what happened in Skagerrak."

"Now people are swinging in the other direction. This has happened in the last couple of

weeks and again the popular impression is absurd. There can be no immediate invasion of England because, while Germany had complete mastery of the air over Scandinavia she does not have it over England by a long shot.

"Defensively, Britain is greatly superior. Her Spitfire, which

I flew last summer, is a superior plane to any which the Germans have in great numbers. Therefore, no invasion of England is possible until that superiority of the air over England is achieved."
