BOARD PONDERES OUTDOOR SWIM POOL AT KUHS

Discussion of the possibilities of constructing an outdoor swimming pool on Klamath Union high school property at Modoc field was a feature of Thursday afternoon's meeting of the city recreation committee.

It was brought out that there is an abundance of hot water at Modoc field from natural sources, which could be used for a pool. The discussion embraced suggestions that the high school administration and the city recreation departments might work out a cooperative agreement for the construction and operation of such a pool.

For several years there has been agitation here for the development of a community swimming pool of the type suggested for Modoc field. No definite plans were developed at the Thursday meeting, but the recreation committee discussed the project at some length.

The recreation committee vetoed a proposal that the city recreation department be the central supervising agency for Rocky Point resort if it is turned over by the forest service for the use of local organizations with recreation projects.

Members of the committee unanimously held the view that the Rocky Point program, as outlined by Supervisor Karl Janouch of the Rogue River forest in a letter received here, is a most worthy enterprise. However, they agreed that the city recreation department and its director, Gerald Murray, have their hands full conducting the present program, and could not assume the added responsibility of Rocky Point.

A delegation from the Conger school Parent-Teachers association asked the committee to make some sort of arrangements for a recreation program for the school. They said that if some suitable grounds and equipment could be arranged, mothers of the district would be willing to assume supervisory duties.

The committee authorized Director Murray to discuss with the city school authorities the matter of permitting use of the Conger school grounds and certain school facilities for the proposed program.
