

June Trifle Is Easily Prepared Summer Dessert

Fresh, canned or quick-frozen fruit plays a stellar role in hot weather menus. For a party dinner, the June Trifle given below makes a spectacular appearance. It can be prepared in advance. The other two recipes are for simple fresh fruit variations.

June Trifle

(Serves 10 to 12)

One package lemon-flavored gelatin, 1 package strawberry-flavored gelatin, 2 pints hot water, 1 cup diced canned pineapple, 12 marshmallows, finely cut, lady fingers or strips of cake, canned pineapple tingers, 1 cup cream, whipped.

Dissolve each package of fruit-flavored gelatin in 1 pint of hot water. Turn into shallow pans. Chill until firm. Cut in cubes. Combine lemon-flavored gelatin cubes and pineapple. Combine strawberry-flavored gelatin cubes and marshmallows.

Line large serving dish alternately with lady fingers and pineapple tingers. Place layer of lemon-flavored gelatin mixture in serving dish, then layer of strawberry-flavored gelatin mixture; repeat, finishing with

layer of strawberry-flavored gelatin mixture. Top with whipped cream. Garnish with gelatin cubes, if desired.

Broiled Grapefruit

Cut grapefruit in half, prepare for the table. Place in oven 10 minutes to heat through. Then place in broiler and brown delicately. Serve immediately.

Pineapple on the Halfshell (One pineapple serves 6 to 8) Cut pineapple in six or eight sections, lengthwise. Remove

Try Quick Frozen Foods and Save Time and Effort

The urge to cut down on kitchen time in the "merrie month of June" brings us to the subject of quick frozen meats, fish, fruits and vegetables. For summer cooking, either in the city or at your shack in the woods or at the beach. They solve the eating problem deliciously.

In order to get best results, follow carefully the instructions printed on package for thawing and cooking. If these quick frozen foods cost a few cents more, remember that there is no waste. During vacation, a few extra cents are permitted in the budget.

Swordfish With Cucumber Sauce

(Serves Six)

One box quick-frozen swordfish steaks, broiled, 1½ cups finely chopped cucumber, 1 teaspoon salt, 1 teaspoon pepper, 1 tablespoon scraped onion, 1½ to 2 tablespoons vinegar.

To broil swordfish, spread swordfish steaks (frozen or thawed) with softened butter and sprinkle with salt and pepper. Place on well-greased broiler and broil 10 to 12 minutes, turning to brown both sides. Serve with cucumber sauce.

For cucumber sauce, drain cu-

cumber; add remaining ingredients and mix lightly. Chill.

Twelvemonth Strawberry Tapioca

(Serves Four)

One box (1 lb.) quick-frozen sliced strawberries, thawed; 1 cup strawberry juice and water, 2 tablespoons quick-cooking tapioca, dash of salt.

Drain berries and add water to juice to make 1 cup. Combine strawberry juice and water,

quick cooking tapioca, sugar, and salt in saucepan and mix well. Bring mixture quickly to a full boil over direct heat, stirring constantly. Remove from fire. (Mixture will be thin. Do not overcook.) Add fruit. Cool, stirring occasionally — mixture thickens as it cools. Chill. Serve with plain or whipped cream.

MEXICAN MURALIST ARRIVES AT FAIR

SAN FRANCISCO, June 7 (UP) — Diego Rivera, Mexican revolutionary muralist, went to Treasure Island Thursday to dash off one of his heroic frescoes of the tourist trade.

Rivera is the star among 60 artists engaged for "art in action," a feature of the Golden Gate international exposition's palace of fine arts in which fairgoers can see painters, sculptors and muralists at work. The Rivera fresco, 45 by 22 feet, will be only runner-up in size at the show, however. Herman Volz, Swiss-American artist, is doing a mosaic 42 by 40, depicting the heroes of science from Darwin to Dr. Ernest Lawrence, atom-smasher.

Rivera, who flew here from Mexico City, looked over his workshop in the fine arts palace today and will start outlining tomorrow.
