BOSTON, June 13 (AP-USA) A moderately active demand was being received for several kinds of domestic wools in Boston today. Mills were showing a great deal of resistance to the recent advances in prices. Some buying, however, was in progress at the advanced prices. Good French combed length, fine territory wools, in original bags, were bringing from 85-87 cents, scoured basis. Graded lines, fine territory wools, were selling at 83-88 cents, scoured basis, depending upon length, ranging from short to good French combed. The demand was moderate and prices were steady at 38-39 cents, in the grease, delivered for country-packed three-eighths and quarter blood bright fleece wools.
