

The Dalles Known As Nation's 'Farthest Inland Port' Since Bonneville Created Big Lake

The Dalles, saluted in today's White Satin sugar advertisement, is located on the banks of the Columbia river, at the head of "Bonneville lake," formed by the construction of Bonneville dam. It is known as the nation's "farthest inland sea port."

The Dalles is the "hub" for east-west and north-south highways, including the Columbia river highway, Old Oregon trail highway, Dalles-California highway and the new scenic highway to Grand Coulee dam. The city is located 93 miles from Portland, at the eastern portal of the Columbia gorge, the only water grade channel through the Cascade mountains to or from the coast.

The main contributing factors to its present economic position are transportation, water power, timber and agriculture. The agricultural income arises from diversified sources. The earliest vegetables on the Portland public markets come from The Dalles, where they are raised on the warm sandy loam along the Columbia at an elevation of 100 feet, while wheat testing 64 pounds to the bushel is raised in the back country at an elevation of over 3000 feet. Cherries, apricots, peaches, pears and apples of excellent size and quality are grown on the frost-free hillside and rolling country around The Dalles, Mosier and Dufur.

The average annual income from agricultural products is approximately \$5,000,000, 40 per cent of which comes from cereal grain, of which wheat contributes 90 per cent, 25 per cent comes from livestock, mostly sheep; 20 per cent from fruits and vegetables; other sources are dairying, poultry and beef.

A modern cannery annually cans immense quantities of Columbia river salmon; also yields of tomatoes, cherries, peaches and pears.

Cherries represent the largest fruit crop. Besides furnishing many tons of cherries for the fresh fruit markets, The Dalles district puts up annually more than 75,000 barrels of cherries in brine for maraschino and candied cherry manufacturers.

Two large flour mills in The Dalles manufacture wheat products for domestic and export use.

A large tank farm for petroleum products is now in operation west of The Dalles city limits. These products are brought by barge from Portland and transhipped via truck to interior points. Later these products will reach The Dalles in tank ships. Other industries include a forest products treating plant; also a good-sized lumber mill.

Peaches Will Fit in Most Anywhere in Your Plans

Peaches and cream—that's about the last word in fruit perfection. But for a change now and then, try peaches in some other way. For breakfast, try them and serve with crisp bacon and rolls. Use firm but ripe peaches. Cut in half and remove pits. Sprinkle lightly with salt and then roll in brown sugar. Fry them gently in hot bacon drippings. That's a new brand of breakfast surprise.

For luncheon, serve them baked. Use large peaches. Peel, cut in half, remove pits. Into each cavity, place a little butter, about 1 teaspoon sugar, a teaspoon lemon juice and a shake of cinnamon. Bake in moderate oven (350 degrees F.) for about 15 or 20 minutes. Serve hot with cold cream.

Peach ice cream is rated as one of the best of all frozen desserts. Here are two recipes, one for the automatic refrigerator, one for the old-fashioned and ever popular hand freezer.

Peach Ice Cream for Refrigerator

One and one-half cups fresh peach pulp, 1/3 cup (or more to taste) granulated sugar, a teaspoon salt, 1 tablespoon lemon juice, 1 cup heavy cream, well whipped, 11 cup evaporated milk.

Sprinkle sugar over peach pulp and stand 10 minutes. Then add salt and lemon juice. Stir and stand 5 minutes. Combine gently the whipped cream and undiluted evaporated milk. Add

to peach pulp mixture. Freeze in refrigerator tray until mushy. Remove from tray and scrape bottom and sides until smooth. Return to tray and freeze for 3 hours more.

Peach Ice Cream for Hand Freezer

Three cups fresh peach pulp, a teaspoon salt, 11 cups granulated sugar, 1/3 teaspoon almond extract, 1 quart heavy cream, 1 1/3 tablespoons lemon juice. Add salt to peach pulp. Sprinkle pulp with sugar, lemon juice and almond extract. Stand for about 10 minutes, stirring several times. Chill, then add cream (do not whip the cream.) Freeze in hand freezer, using 3 parts ice to 1 part salt. Remove dasher, then pack for 2 hours in 4 parts ice and 1 part salt. This will ripen the ice cream and give it a smoother texture.
