RAILROAD NEWS

SOUTHERN PACIFIC BUYS TRUCK FIRM

Purchase by Southern Pacific company this month of the Pacific Truck Express will greatly increase Southern Pacific's capacity to serve Oregon shippers, according to Herman W. Klein, general freight agent, Portland. The Pacific Truck Express provides local trucking service in Oregon and a through service to California points. Present schedules and service will be maintained or improved, Klein said, and acquisition of the line will make it possible to coordinate rail and truck shipments, providing greater flexibility of freight transportation for Oregon shippers.

Southern Pacific has provided overnight service with store-door pickup and delivery between Portland and many western Oregon points for the past several years. With acquisition of the Pacific Truck Express this overnight service can now be extended to virtually every point in western Oregon, Klein said.

Addition of truck facilities to the company's rail service in western Oregon has long been desired by Southern Pacific, according to Klein, but it was only recently that impediment obstacles were removed and the service established.

A Southern Pacific safety meeting originally scheduled for Monday has been postponed until Thursday, July 18. The meeting will be held in the circuit court rooms, at 7:30 o'clock.
