

# BRITISH PUT BLOCKADE ON SPAIN ROUTE

In her blockade of the reich, it was reported today. An "important statement" in which Minister of Economic Warfare Hugh Dalton was expected to describe for the house of commons this afternoon just what measures had been adopted was postponed indefinitely without explanation.

**War's Lifeblood**  
Britain's blockade sprung new leaks with the fall of France, and one of the most important threats to Britain was the flow of oil, lifeblood of modern mechanized war, through General Franco's nationalist Spain.

There now are direct land routes from Germany across France to Spain, giving Germany indirect use of innumerable Spanish ports which before the fall of France were useless to her.

Linked with the blockade situation was an agreement concluded Tuesday among Britain, Spain and Portugal which would dispose of more colonial products. The British agreed payments should be made through the British-Spanish clearing system.

Approximately 200,000 barrels of oil were aboard two tankers whose sailing from a Texas port was halted a few days ago by the maritime commission.

Morgenthau declined to go into details. He did tell reporters, however, that the action had "no relations" with reports from London that Great Britain also was trying to prevent oil from getting into Germany through Spain.

Other authoritative sources said that the two tankers, denied clearance to sail for Spain until they unloaded their oil on shore, were the tankers Aryan and Nevada.

They were stopped July 10 and 11 at Houston, Tex., by the "office of merchant ship movements" set up by President Roosevelt recently under Morgenthau to supervise departures and arrivals of both foreign and domestic ships.

First word that the tankers had been held up came from the maritime commission.

people who lived here at the same time that such animals as camels, elephants and prehistoric horses roamed the country?

If it could be definitely proved that the bones of these animals and the bones or artifacts of human beings were lying together as they had naturally fallen rather than being thrown together accidentally by such processes as erosion, then the answer would be yes.

## Camels, Elephants

Pending further study of field notes and specimens, the only conclusions Dr. Cressman is at present willing to state are these. It is certain, he says, that camels, elephants and carnivora of various types once inhabited this lake bed when perhaps a slough provided the only water available in the basin, and it appears probable that a race of people vied with them in the struggle for existence.

How long ago this was, is a question that stimulates not only the layman's curiosity but the scientist's ingenuity. The surest method devised to yield a reliable answer is the analysis, in relation to known geologic facts, of soil covering the bones and artifacts.

5500 B. C.

In studying Lower Klamath lake in this connection, Dr. Cressman obtained the collaboration of three outstanding specialists in the field of geology: Dr. Ernest Antevs, of Globe, Ariz., Dr. Ira Allison of Oregon State college, and Dr. W. D. Smith of the University of Oregon.

Results of their investigations, Dr. Cressman stated, indicate that in all probability, the period during which these

ancient people and prehistoric animals lived in this valley was between 2200 and 5500 b. c. or from 4200 to 7500 years ago. This would mean that they may have witnessed and fled from the volcanic fury which produced the older formations in the lava beds and which gave us Crater lake.

sible destruction to the enemy's vital war supplies" and make new air bases "acquired nearer our shores practically untenable."

They "have made the enemy realize that if our air force is numerically inferior to his own, it is vastly superior in both machines and personnel," he asserted.

LONDON, July 25 (AP)—German air raiders swarmed in on British shipping and inland objectives today while the admiralty announced that a fast nazi torpedo boat last night had torpedoed and sunk the French ship Meknes near England's Portland naval base.

Early today about 80 nazi planes swooped down upon one merchant convoy off the southeast coast, inviting a battle which a British witness said made the air "alive with aircraft."
