WHEELER HITS DRAFT DRIVE AS UNNEEDED

Army Seeking to "Saddle Draft on Country," Senator Claims

WASHINGTON, Aug. 13 (AP)—Senator Wheeler (D-Mont.) asserted today that the army general staff was "utilizing the present crisis to saddle conscription on the country" even though compulsory military training was unnecessary for the nation's defense.

Disputes Claim Senator Burke (D-Neb.) that voluntary enlistments would not provide enough manpower to defend the nation.

Brig. Gen. William E. Shedd said today that the amount of time required by congress to consider conscription legislation had brought about a postponement of war department plans to have 900,000 men in uniform early this fall.

Apparently determined to give Britain no letup from air attack, Germany sent waves of bombers across the English channel. Latest bombing objectives were the great naval base of Portsmouth and nearby Portland (1) where Berlin claimed heavy damage was inflicted, also the coast in the vicinity of Dover (2). Barrage balloons were attacked.

Houses on the Old Fort road were endangered by a blaze that shot down from the summit of Knob hill, favorite parking spot for lovers and sightseers.

Newest fire last night was reported on Grizzly mountain, southeast of here. It was burning in slash. Weyerhaeuser Timber company firemen helped bring this blaze under control.
