James Webb was elected committeeman for precinct No. 9. Talks were given at the meet-

ing by Paul Landry, nominee for the legislature; Paul Matthews, nominee for county clerk; Harold Merryman, nominee for district attorney and former county chairman; Arthur Schupp and Henry Anderson. T. J. Prather told of republican gains at Keno, and Schmitz reported on the state meeting.

IDAHO NYA PROJECT OPEN FOR OREGON

PORTLAND, Aug. 14 (Special)—Boys and girls in western and southern Oregon communities who seek employment on NYA may now apply for assignment to the resident work-experience project at Weiser, Idaho, according to an announcement here by Ivan G. Munro, state NYA administrator.

The Weiser project, operated on a regional basis, has an enrollment of 325 young men and 75 young women. Oregon's

quota is 110 youths, of whom about 65 have already been selected, Munro said.

Each youth enrolls for a period of at least 12 months, it was announced, and the young people register for vocational training courses in occupations of their own choosing.

Munro explained that enrollees earn their board, room and medical care through assignment to work-experience projects. Monthly wage is \$29.50, which provides about \$10 a month for personal needs.

Youths are housed on a campus equipped with complete recreational facilities, including library, auditorium, gymnasium, swimming pool and tennis courts. Leisure-time activities

include art, dramatics, music, dances and club organizations.

The project provides training and work-experience in the following occupations: agriculture, including specialized fields; construction, including specialized fields; commercial cooking and baking; home economics and homemaking; mechanics and shop training for selected youths; business training for selected youths; landscape design and construction.

Applicants must be between the ages of 18 and 24, inclusive, and must register with the Oregon state employment service. Detailed information may be obtained from Earl I. Rice, NYA area director in Medford.
