

STATE REJECTS SPRAGUE RIVER ROAD PROPOSAL

PORTLAND, Aug. 22 (AP) — The state highway commission rejected a proposal last night to include the Sprague River road between Chiloquin and Beatty in Klamath county in the state highway system.

State Highway Engineer R. H. Baldock told the board the inclusion, coupled with requested improvements, would cost \$854,000.

The board delayed action on a proposal to improve the Midland secondary state highway No. 420 in Klamath county at a cost of \$65,000. Chairman Henry F. Cabell, in answer to a complaint that Klamath county had not received its share of highway development, recommended that the highway department "look around for the best project in the county."

The commission approved the construction of a \$2000 wooden sidewalk on the Rogue River bridge at Gold Hill and landscaping of the Bend underpass section of The Dalles California highway at a cost of \$800.

The board authorized acquisition of right-of-way for Oregon coast highway widening between North Bend and Marshfield.

The highway commission considered bids on nine projects estimated to cost more than a quarter of a million dollars.

The group opened its regular August two-day meeting after inspecting parks and roads on the Oregon coast.

Low bids opened today included:

Furnishing of 16,300 cubic yards of crushed gravel for the Little Butte-Cascade gorge section of Crater Lake highway in Jackson county, R. I. Stewart and sons, Medford, \$18,425.

Reconstruction of Henley flume and widening of canal bridge south of Klamath Falls on Klamath Falls Main highway, Clifford A. Dunn, Klamath Falls, \$9260.

TRUCK UNION EYES WIDE SAFETY CODE

DENVER, Aug. 22 (AP) — Officials of the International Brotherhood of Teamsters (AFL) are preparing a standard code of rules of the road, designed to promote highway safety, for consideration at the union's four-day western district convention opening here September 1.

President William Green of the American Federation of Labor will address the convention at noon PST Labor day, September 2.

Floats in the Labor day parade will show the development of transportation. Union officials said that Oregon roses, Idaho potatoes, Washington apples and California oranges, lemons, raisins, grapes and prunes would be tossed to spectators along the parade route.

Dave Beck, western teamster leader, will be toastmaster at the principal convention banquet. Addresses will be given by Meyer L. Lewis of Los Angeles, western director of the AFL; Gov. Ralph L. Carr and Chief Justice Benjamin Hilliard of the Colorado supreme court.

ONE-YEAR SENTENCE SET IN AUTO THEFT

Domingo Bencomo, convicted of larceny of an auto, was sentenced to one year in the state penitentiary Wednesday by Circuit Court Judge Edward B. Ashurst.

Bencomo was charged with stealing a coupe belonging to Herbert B. Million, 2441 1/2 Eberlein avenue, on August 14. According to police, after taking the car, he pursued a woman in the car and crashed into a new building under construction at Broad and Wall street. He was charged with drunken driving at the time and given a seven-day sentence.

Cole Brothers Circus Show, Bigger and Better, Due Soon

Circus day this year in Klamath Falls will be Friday, September 6, when the trains bearing Cole Bros. circus will pull



into town and hundreds of performers and animals will wend their way to the circus grounds. Equipment, wagons, horses, tractors, elephants, all will be put into use to transport the huge show through the streets.

Ken Maynard and his wonder horse, Tarzan, and scores of cowboys, cowgirls, Indians, and frontiersmen, all rigged out in their flashy costumes, will start for the lot and by noon everything will be ready for the two performances to be given here.

New animals from Singapore, India and Africa, together with

tigers, lions and other species from the various zoos in America, have been added to the menagerie.

From now until circus day advance representatives for the show will be in town making final arrangements. Purchasing agents will be here lining up groceries, meats, bread (a thousand loaves by the way), eggs, milk, sugar, and so on for the 2000 meals that are served every day to the personnel of the circus.

Six thousand pounds of hay, 200 bushels of oats and 3000 pounds of straw, more if it rains so as to keep the grounds dry, 400 pounds of bran, are just a few items for the animal department.

Over 200 acts with the show this year in addition to Ken Maynard, include the Loyal Repenski family of bareback riders, the Escalante troupe, the Gasca troupe, Weber brothers and Chaitila, the Martinez family from old Mexico, the skating Rockets from Oslo, Norway, 50 clowns headed by Otto Grubling, world's funniest pantomimist, and a gorgeous pageant entitled "La Habana," which serves as a prelude to the circus proper.

Two performances will be given in Klamath Falls starting at 2 and 8 p. m., and the doors to the big tent will open one hour in advance to allow patrons to inspect the huge double menagerie carried this year.

EFFECT OF BRIDGES MEASURE PONDERED

WASHINGTON, Aug. 22 (AP) — The senate immigration committee has said that it was "not interested in the alien involved" when it recommended recently that Harry Bridges, west coast labor leader, be investigated by the justice department rather than deported immediately.

The committee made known its views yesterday in a report to the senate explaining its proposal to substitute an investigation for a house-approved bill calling for summary deportation of the Australian-born alien.

"The fate of the individual alien is not important as compared with the fate of all of our people who might ultimately be injured thereby," the committee said.

"We in America inherit a treasure. That treasure is not in gold or land or other resources. It is the treasure of liberty. The right to be free, the right to think and speak, and to print, and to worship—these are our inheritances. He who strikes at them strikes at our democracy itself."
