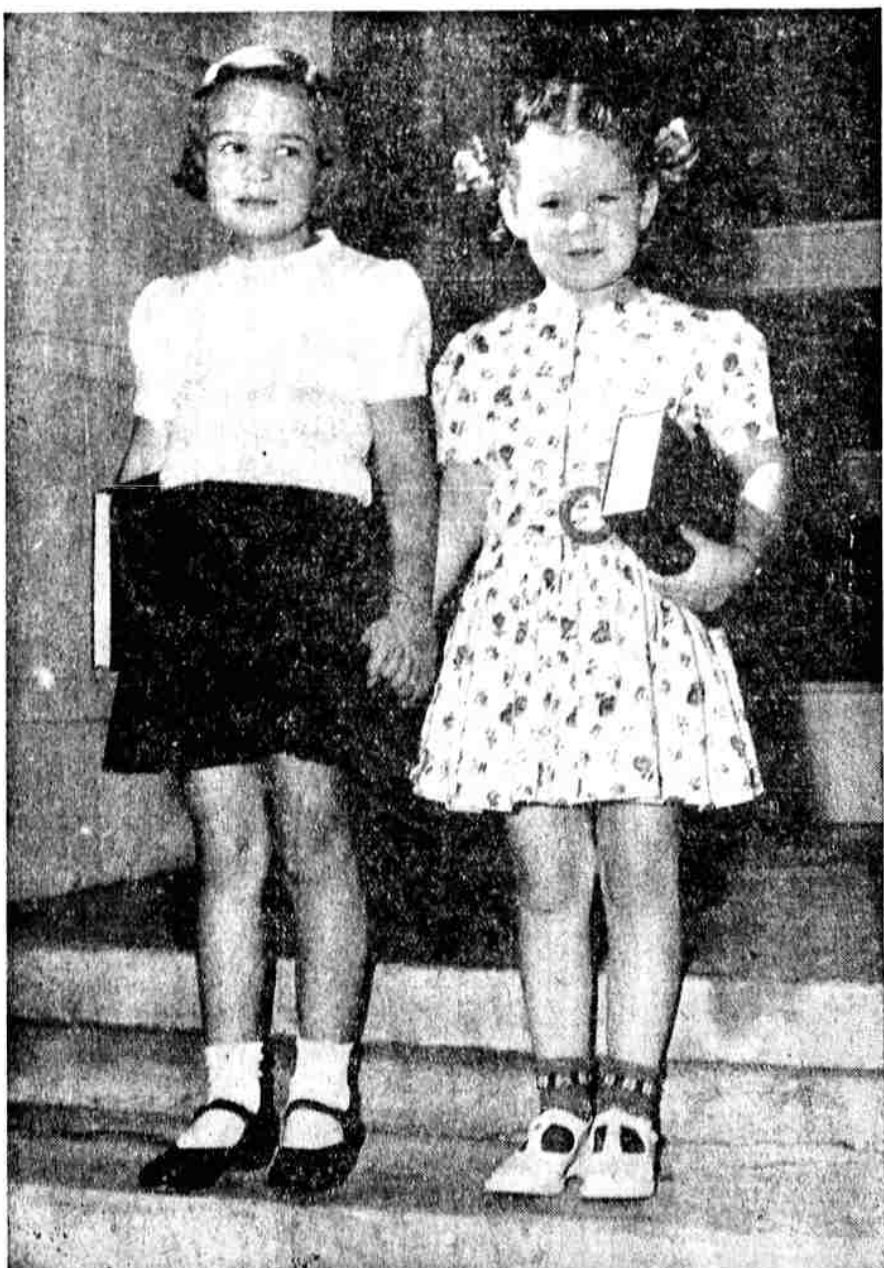

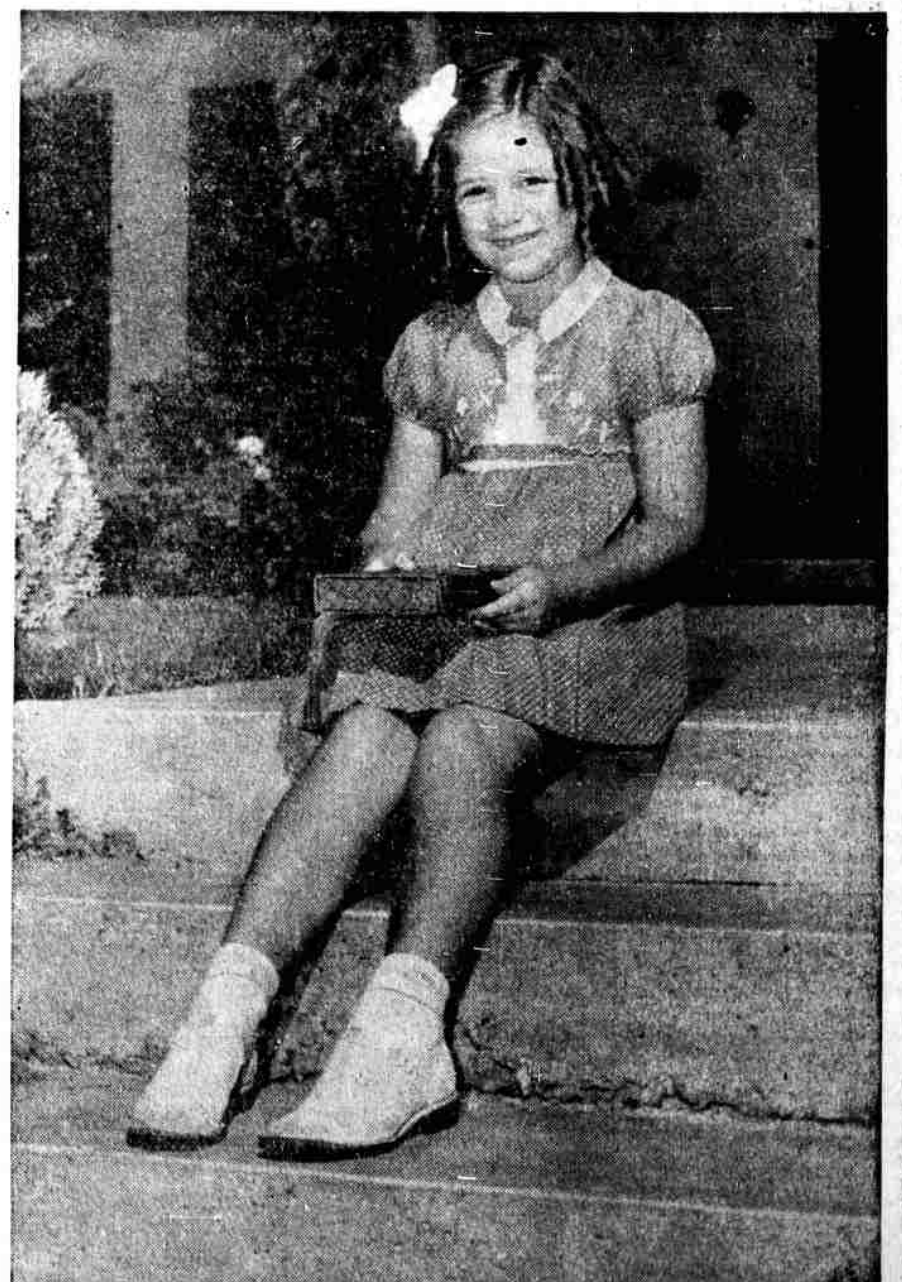
MASTER JOHN BURGE MASON, son of Mr. and Mrs. Burge Mason Jr., of 76 Washington street, John enters his first year at Fremont.
