

FILM STAR SEES U. S.-BRITAIN BOND

SEATTLE, Oct. 10 (AP)—While auctioning off everything from one of his own autographs to one of his prized thoroughbred horses, Victor McLaglen, "Tough Guy" of the screen, told a Seattle audience Tuesday night he soon foresees the time when the "British Empire will merge with the United States of America."

McLaglen was the guest of honor at a meeting of the Friends of Britain, Inc.

The meeting was held in the swank Rainier club, where the first thing the visitor sees in the lobby is a huge stuffed elephant's head and tusks donated by one of the long-time members.

Before a crowd of 250 men, most of whom were in evening dress, the burly McLaglen who fought for the British in the Boer and World wars, said:

"With all this merciless bombing of the British Empire, Hitler must be saying it is time for the British people to cry 'Stop this murder! But 345,000,000 Britons are ready to fight to the end!'"

Continuing, he said: "We are not mere cousins—we are blood brothers. The time will come when the British Empire and the United States of America will merge."

Some 250 business men gathered at the club in formal dress last night for the Friends of Britain, Inc., party, and contributed better than \$600 toward buying "Spitfires and Hurricanes" for the British royal air force.

FREEDOM IS URGED FOR FOREIGN-BORN

Continued freedom of economic opportunity which has helped people of foreign birth to contribute outstandingly to the upbuilding of the United States was urged today in a statement made public here by Dr. P. O. Riley, director of the Naturalized Citizens division of the State of Oregon.

Dr. Riley warned that these opportunities have been greatly curtailed in the past seven years and declared that the election of Wendell L. Willkie as president offers the surest means of reviving them.

"Freedom of opportunity under the American system was the magnet that attracted millions of foreign-born to our shores in past generations," he pointed out. "The United States owes much of its greatness today to the devotion, thrift, courage and hard work of these people."

"People from all nations of Europe came to America because it offered them a chance to prosper, to rear their families and live in comfort and peace under our ideals of freedom. They left their native lands in many cases because of absolutism, tyranny and oppression."

Dr. Riley cites Wendell L. Willkie's acceptance speech as a guarantee that under his presidency, the opportunities which many people believe are lost will be restored.

"Mr. Willkie has emphasized that he will assure an opportunity for every person to stand on his feet, work and fight," said Dr. Riley.

Merry Chase With Death Reported By Leader's Son

PORTLAND, Oct. 10 (AP)—Michael Lender, son of Colonel John Lender of the British army, is making a habit of escaping death, according to a letter from his father, a former University of Oregon ROTC instructor, received by friends here today.

"Michael had a rather stirring six weeks," Col. Lender wrote. "Every bit of his kit got destroyed by a shell in the retreat (in Flanders) and nearly all his command were killed (in Flanders and at Dunkerque). His ship then got bombed and he was missing two weeks, then he walked into my room in London and went off immediately with me to a tennis party."

"I introduced him to a girl whom he took out to dinner and dance that night. He proposed two days later and married her two days after that by special license. Two more days and he sailed for a special job in Africa, but two days out he got torpedoed and was picked up the following day with seven others on a raft in the Atlantic and came home to his bride."

DIES CLAIMS 5TH COLUMN EVIDENCE

ORANGE, Tex., Oct. 10 (UP)—Rep. Martin Dies, D., Tex., said Wednesday night his house committee investigating un-American activities had uncovered enough evidence to expose the "whole fifth column in the United States."

Dies refused to reveal the "documentary evidence" he said the committee had sent to President Roosevelt and Secretary of State Cordell Hull.

At his home here Dies said he would not comment because "I am resolved not to complicate this country's foreign relations. It is up to the state department to formulate any policy that might be influenced by committee findings."

Dies said he purposely was remaining here "to facilitate uninterrupted study of the information" by Mr. Roosevelt and the state department. Any details must come from them, he said.
