COUNTY'S 1941 BUDGET TO BE AIRED FRIDAY

Final hearing on the 1941 Klamath county budget is scheduled for 10 a. m. Friday at the county courtroom. At that time the county court and budget committee will discuss the budget with any interested taxpayer, and after the hearing the 1941 financial schedule will be put in final shape for certification to the county assessor.

It has been indicated representatives of the suburban districts may appear at the budget committee for further discussion of the item for law enforcement work in the suburbs.

The tentative budget provides \$600 for this work. Suburban representatives, appearing at previous budget hearings, asked for considerably more than that, and are expected to renew their requests at the final hearing.

No change is expected in the total to be raised by taxation for 1941, regardless of any adjustments that may be made in single items. The new budget takes advantage of the 6 per cent limitation allowed by law for operating expenses, but decreases in debt service requirements promises a reduction in the non-operative or involuntary budget, which is not affected by the 6 per cent limitation.

PORTLAND FLIGHT TRAINING LIST DROPS OFF

PORTLAND, Ore., Oct. 24 (UP)—Waiting lists for civilian pilot training courses dropped off to nothing Wednesday night in Portland after publication of a pledge required of each applicant to enter military service upon completion of both primary and secondary flight training courses.

Carl W. Nelson, Oregon director of the program, announced the pledge did not require an obligation to enter the military services but was merely to provide a statement of intention to use the civilian pilot training program as a part of the national defense.

Not only were waiting lists eliminated, but local schools found it difficult to fill their quotas, Nelson said.

ABSENTEE BALLOTS CONTINUE TO GO OUT OF KLAMATH

Absentee balloting continued at a fast pace at the county clerk's office. Deputy Clerk Harry Kellis said Thursday that more than 400 ballots had been sent out, and many are now coming back. Absentee ballots must be back in the clerk's office three days before the general election November 5.

Poll books are now being made up and other work rushed in preparation for the general voting.

ACKERMAN HOME FROM FBI MEET

Acting Police Judge Lelch Ackerman returned Wednesday night from Eugene where he attended the advanced class at the FBI school held at the University of Oregon under federal supervision.

Ackerman spoke on the Tuesday program, "Interviews and Report Writing," and answered numerous questions put by FBI men. Between 35 and 40 police officers from over the entire state attended the session Ackerman said.
