

REFUGEE CLOTHING RUSHED TO LONDON

With the announcement by Mrs. Herbert Hoover of the appointment of a committee of western women assisting the Salvation Army in securing clothing for more than a million refugee women and children, Salvationists throughout the twelve western states were busy today preparing machinery for the classifying, packaging and shipping of warm garments for cold refugees.

Every school child on the Pacific seaboard will be asked to bring garments to school during the week ending Friday, November 8. These garments will then be sent to New York for immediate shipment to London.

The Salvation Army has thrown its full resources of personnel and material into bringing relief to the victims of the air raids in London and other English cities and towns, according to a cable received at the Army's San Francisco headquarters, from its international office in London.

Hundreds of Salvation Army officers from the slum, social, and corps departments are engaged day and night in bringing relief to the injured, hungry and homeless. The cable states that these officers are feeding and housing multitudes in Army buildings, some of which are surrounded by destroyed property, and elsewhere, and are transporting families and their salvaged furniture from shattered houses to new surroundings. They are also distributing clothing sent from the United States, Canada, and Australia.

Six of the Army's mobile canteens have already been taken from military service and assigned to the London fire department to provide food and first aid stations, as well as ambulance service.

The international headquarters of the Salvation Army within the shadow of St. Paul's cathedral in London has been unharmed, but corps halls and red shield clubs have been destroyed in various places. The Army's work continues unabated in spite of the destruction of property and the severe handicaps imposed, bringing relief to the needy in all European areas outside the domination of Nazi military authority, the dispatch says.
