\$10,000 SUIT FILED IN CAR WRECK DEATH

Will Blackman, well-known Henley potato farmer, Tuesday filed suit for \$10,000 damages against the Turner Chevrolet company and Kenneth Stuart as a result of an accident on the Merrill highway Sunday, September 29, in which his son, Philip Blackman, 22, was killed.

Blackman alleges in his complaint that Stuart, a salesman for the motor firm, was guilty of "reckless, careless and negligent operation" of his car when the Stuart machine crashed into the rear of his son's auto at the intersection of the Crystal Springs road and the Merrill highway about 1:30 in the morning.

Blackman is suing as the administrator for the estate of Philip Blackman.

Young Blackman's car burst into flames immediately after the impact with the second machine and slid off into the ditch. The youth was imprisoned in the flaming pyre and, it was believed, died almost instantly. Stuart suffered a broken kneecap and injuries about the head in the crash.

An inquest into Blackman's death resulted in the recommendation that further investigation be made of the accident.

KLAMATH DROPS IN SAFETY CONTEST

Portland, Marshfield, Newberg and Enterprise again led cities in the 1940 cities traffic safety contest for the month of September, standings compiled by Earl Snell, secretary of state and sponsor of the contest, revealed Wednesday. Marshfield has led the second division for four months, Newberg has been in first place in the third division for two months and Enterprise has stood in first place in the fourth division for five months.

Standings are based on the amount of improvement shown during the current year as compared to the normal accident expectancy over a three-year period. In this manner, each city's record is compared to what may be considered a normal accident experience for that city.

The greatest change registered by any one city was Lakeview in the fourth division which slipped from seventh place to twenty-

third in September. This was due to the fact Lakeview had one traffic fatality during September, the first recorded in that town for four years, the period which was considered in setting up the three-year average for each city in the contest.

GRETA GARBO APPLIES FOR CITIZENSHIP

HOLLYWOOD, Oct. 30 (UP)—Greta Garbo, Swedish motion picture actress, went into federal court unannounced late Tuesday and asked to become a citizen of the United States.

The silent and languorous star surprised court attaches who hardly recognized her by asking for an application for first citizenship papers.

She said she was born in Stockholm 35 years ago, is 5 feet 7 inches tall, weighs 127 pounds and is unmarried.

She listed her full name as Greta Lovisa Garbo and said she came to the country in 1933 aboard the steamship Annie Johnson.

Under federal regulations, she cannot obtain final papers until two years have passed.

'WHISPERING' CAMPAIGN IS DEMO CHARGE

MILWAUKIE, Ore., Oct. 30 (Special)—Bruce Spaulding, democratic nominee for attorney general, charged here Tuesday that the Oregon Commonwealth federation had started a "whispering campaign" against him.

"The campaign apparently has boiled down to a contest between the Commonwealth federation and me," Spaulding, Polk county district attorney the past six years said, adding, "and that's all right with me."

He said a Commonwealth federation report that he had sought its endorsement was "an absolute falsehood. I don't even know where its headquarters are."

Spaulding said that after the Commonwealth federation announced it was supporting I. H. Van Winkle for attorney general, he came upon several false statements that had been made about him by the federation.

The candidate asserted he had no connection with the prosecution of Al Rosser, former

teamster union leader in Oregon, and other labor racketeers. "I would do the same thing over again," Spaulding said.

He said he did not believe the rank and file of labor and honest labor officials were against him because of the prosecutions, explaining "they were just as much opposed to the racketeers as any other persons."
