

WORLD VIEWS ELECTION AS BRITISH HELP

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The world at large appears to be accepting the American election as endorsement of Washington's policy of stone-walling against armed aggression, and of rendering all aid to Britain short of war—an appraisal which in my view is bound to impose a large degree of caution upon both aggressor nations and those which might feel impelled to join them.

If that seems boastful, I would point out that the triple alliance itself—Germany, Italy and Japan—in recent weeks has been displaying deep concern over our continued heavy support of the enemy they are trying to destroy. This worry has deepened with the Nazi failure to invade and crush England.

Russia Quiet
The government controlled press of the three musketeers has alternately chattered threats at us like an angry blue-jay, and tried by cajolery and bribes of territory to swing us into line with the totalitarian "new order." Meantime non-belligerent nations like Russia and Turkey have continued their resistance to axis pressure to join the array against England.

In this connection it is a coincidence of great importance that Russia last night—right on the heels of our election—announced that the soviet's policy is one of continued neutrality and armed vigilance.

Now it would be misleading you if I gave the impression that I have any information entitling me to say that the Russian announcement was connected with the American election. I can only express the belief that there was a connection, since Russia has been watching our attitude toward Britain carefully.

Turks Pleased
The Turks, upon whom Britain must depend so heavily if the axis powers try to force the Dardanelles and break into the near east, showed their pleasure. The Turkish press—and that of the rest of southeastern Europe—figures that the American armament program will be intensified and that there will be uninterrupted help for England. That moral boost is of vast importance to Britain.

The British press is jubilant, on the basis that "America will quicken her stride again and without any of the delays that might have come from the sending of a new man to the white house." London's anxiety to keep up an uninterrupted flow of supplies from the United States is natural, since had she not been given our aid Herr Hitler without much doubt would be dining off his Britannic majesty's gold service now.

Staying Out
The impression prevails in some quarters that England wants us to come into the war. I believe there was a time early in the conflict when a good many Britons did hope for, and work for, that. However, that sentiment would appear to have about disappeared. As I judge the position it was well summed up the other day by a widely known Englishman with whom I was chatting.

"Thank goodness," he exclaimed, "you people have made up your minds to stay out of the war. The war; that could happen to England now would be for you to get into the conflict. We immediately should be cut off from the American supplies, since you would need them for yourselves. That would be a disaster for us."

CANDIDATE WINS ELECTION, WANTS RECOUNT ANYWAY

Buckley, a former WPA clerk, conducted no campaign in September and was unnoticed until returns showed he was nominated overwhelmingly.
