The ground is so wet from fall rains and snows that "cats" are often necessary to pull the trucks in and out of fields for loading. And yet the morning of November 10 the ground was so frozen in one field that the digger brought up the potatoes embedded in hard clumps of earth. There is a large, and apparently a very good, crop of potatoes this year.

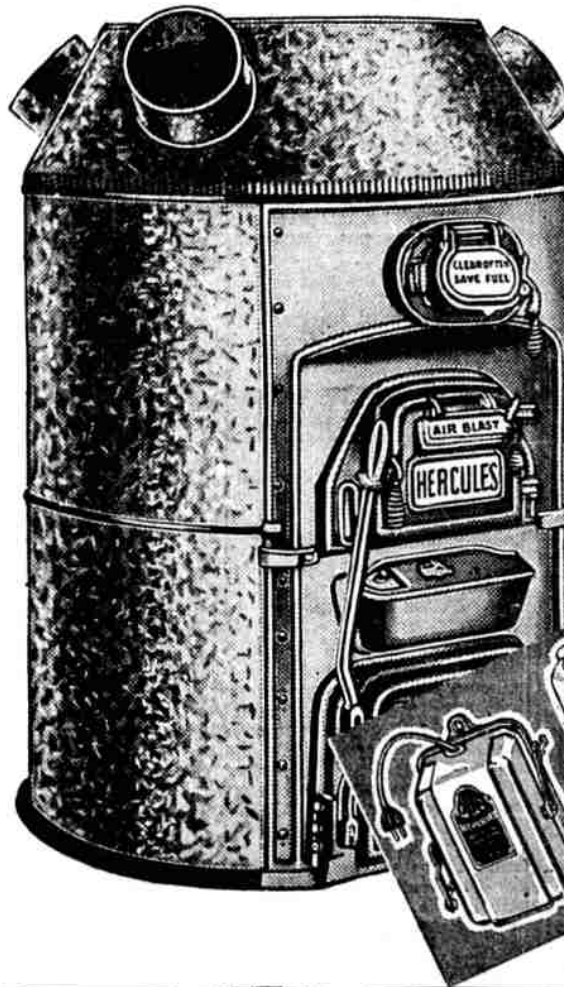

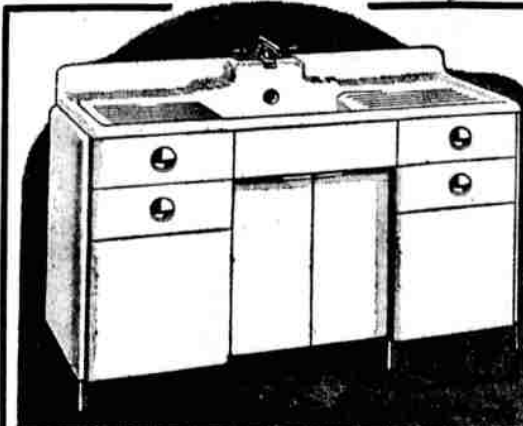
