

# BERLIN RAIDED DURING SOVIET ENVOY'S VISIT

craft carriers Eagle and Illustrious. That meant that planes from at least three British aircraft carriers now are operating against southern Italy. For the Ark Royal has been named in accounts of the bombing of other objectives.

The British aircraft carriers Courageous and Glorious were sunk earlier in the war, and the action against southern Italy is the first known instance of the use of this type of warship in a major action since the ill-fated Norwegian campaign. The Glorious was sunk off Norway; the Courageous in the western part of the English Channel.

ROME, Nov. 14 (AP)—British bomber formations, seeking out the seat of Italian naval power in an effort to deliver crippling blows, again attacked the strongly fortified fleet base at Taranto and raided the southern port of Crotone, the high command said today.

At the same time British announcements of the damaging of half of Italy's six battleships and two of her cruisers in a Monday night aerial attack were described as "fantastic."

On its own account the Italian air force was reported to have counter-attacked the British naval base at Alexandria, bombing a cruiser, and shot aerial torpedoes into a convoy in the eastern Mediterranean to sink one steamer and damage another.

The Italian communiqué said "some damage" was caused to dwellings, three persons were killed and 12 injured.

The bombs at Crotone, across the Gulf of Taranto, were said to have fallen in the harbor.

Wide land and air action on a scattered front from Greece to the Sudan also were reported by the Italian communiqué.

LONDON, Thursday, Nov. 14 (UP)—The British government today announced the creation of a new unified Far Eastern command, and revealed simultaneously that "further reinforcements" already have reached the area where Japan again is threatening southward expansion.

The supreme commander of British forces in the Far East will be Air Chief Marshal Sir Robert Brooke-Popham, who has a longer air service career than any officer now on active duty. It was not revealed whether the reinforcements sent to the Far East were naval, air or land forces, or all three.

Brooke-Popham, who will make his headquarters at Singapore, will command Malaya, Burma and Hongkong and will consult with and cooperate with the naval commander-in-chief of the China and East Indies stations and the commander-in-chief in India.

BERLIN, Thursday, Nov. 14 (UP)—British bombing planes, turned back by a heavy anti-aircraft barrage before they could reach the heart of Berlin, dropped their explosives "at random" in the suburbs last night, an official communiqué reported today.

Several attic fires were started in the bungalow colonies, it was said, but no damage was reported.

LONDON, Thursday, Nov. 14 (UP)—Bad flying weather over the channel and southern England gave London a rest last night and early today while axis raiders were making light attacks on scattered British objectives farther north.

Bombing planes made a few casual thrusts at the metropolitan defenses early in the night. They dropped a handful of bombs which had little effect. Then the all-clear sounded at one of the earliest hours of the air siege of Britain.

SALONIKA, Greece, Nov. 13 (UP)—Usually reliable diplomatic quarters here claimed tonight Emanuel Grazi, former Italian minister to Athens, has resigned from the fascist diplomatic service because of accusations that he misinformed the Italian government regarding prospects of Greek resistance and strength of the Greek army.

## JAPANESE READY TO PUSH FRENCH

troops in northern Indo-China.

Foreign officials saw another immediate source of danger to Indo-China in the current tension with Thailand (Siam). It was held likely that any serious clash between the two might be used as a Japanese pretext for landing troops and "restoring order."

Thus squeezed by Thailand on the west and Japanese military and naval forces on the north and east, it was believed possible that Indo-China would surrender its sovereignty in fact if not in name, without attempting an armed defense.

TOKYO, Nov. 14 (AP)—Imperial headquarters announced today that the Japanese army had completed its withdrawal from Kwangsi province and southwestern Kwangtung province, dropping the curtain on a significant year-long chapter in the Japanese-Chinese war.

The announcement said Japanese forces finally withdrew yesterday from Yamchow, port on the Kwangtung coast through which the expedition which drove last November into Kwangsi and captured Nanning, the capital, was supplied.

The withdrawal was said to have been accomplished "without casualties." (Chinese dispatches had reported recapture of Yamchow after stiff fighting.)

A war office spokesman denied that the withdrawal from the Kwangsi theatre was a prelude to a wholesale evacuation of South China. The Japanese army continues to hold a considerable portion of eastern Kwangtung province, around Canton.

SHANGHAI, Thursday, Nov. 14 (UP)—Japan has evolved a definite formula for tapering off her undeclared war with China and now is preparing for a push to the southward, possibly designed to flank Britain's great Singapore naval base, according to reports in diplomatic circles today.

The Japanese have come to a "final agreement with Russia outlining each nation's sphere of influence in Asia," according to

the reports, and have concentrated a large number of soldiers on Hainan island, off the coast of French Indo-China, which will serve as a starting point for the "southward push."

## Push to Start

A reported British-American decision regarding joint policy in the Pacific and joint use of the Singapore base by the British and American fleets was believed linked to the Japanese activities.

Informed quarters believed the Japanese push will start within a week and will result in an immediate occupation of Saigon and other strategic points in Indo-China not covered by the French-Japanese agreement of September.

The formula for tapering off the China war, it was believed, includes early recognition of the Japan-sponsored "national government of China" in Nanking headed by Former Chinese Premier Wang Chingwei who is said to have assured the Japanese he can obtain support of South China provincial leaders.

Japan's agreement with Russia, according to the reports, includes a cessation of all soviet assistance to the Chinese nationalist government in Chungking headed by Generalissimo Chiang Kai-Shek.

SALONIKA, Greece, Nov. 13 (UP)—(Passed by censor)—Italian alpine columns numbering several thousand men tonight were reported wandering aimlessly in the mountains and valleys of the rugged Pindus region, harassed constantly by Greek "mopping up" patrols.

sired by General Franco's government, it was said, to feed and rehabilitate a hungry and impoverished Spain, which has been unable to achieve recovery from its long and destructive civil war.

American officials had no comment on the Spanish government's reported request for financial aid.

Summer Welles, acting secretary of state—without mentioning the loan question—disclosed, however, that ways and means of assisting Spain were under consideration by American officials.

None of the proposed plans to aid Spain have crystallized, Welles said, and no final decision had been made. He added—significantly, in the view of diplomatic circles—that Spain's economic problems appeared to be a question for the American Red Cross.
