Britain Offers Trade Plans to Russia, Report

LONDON, Nov. 21 (AP)—Lord Halifax, foreign secretary, told parliament today that Britain had made "certain proposals" for a trade agreement with soviet Russia and "had some reason to believe" the proposals would be acceptable.

The proposals also have been made, he disclosed in a speech to the house of lords, for "a compromise settlement arising out of soviet annexations of territory" with regard to British obligations. Friction has arisen out of Russia's absorption of the three Baltic states last summer.

Other proposals "of a general character" have been made, he added, "to establish greater confidence between the two governments in the political sphere." Adolf Hitler, the foreign secretary declared, is pursuing "his usual policy" of "combined cajolery and brutality" with France.

BIRD HUNTER WITH RIFLE ARRESTED

Hunting game birds with a .22 calibre rifle brought trouble to James Ethridge Godowa.

State police picked up Godowa in the Bly district Wednesday, and charged him with hunting by prohibited methods. They added that he had no duck stamp.
