

Joe Louis Won't See Contenders

Fresh Money Lengthens Billy's Edge; Savold Seeks June Title Shot

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NEW YORK, Nov. 28 (UP)—Billy Conn and Lee Savold concluded training today for their heavyweight contenders' battle at Madison Square garden Friday night, with the price lengthening to 4-1 favoring Conn.

Conn, who can't get fat, and Savold, who has difficulty keeping lean, are campaigning for a June title shot at Joe Louis, but Louis won't attend the bout, although he'll be in Boston Friday night to begin training for his title tilt with Al McCoy in the Hub city Dec. 16.

Price-maker Eddie Borden said fresh money from Pittsburgh, Conn's home town, lengthened the price Wednesday but he expected heavy Savold backing Thursday to hammer the odds down again "possibly as low as 2 to 1."

When the principals concluded training for their 12-round brawl, Conn's weight was announced as 178 pounds. This figure is considered a phony on Jacobs' Beach, because the light heavyweight king scaled only 172 in his last bout with Al McCoy at Boston on Oct. 18.

And it is known definitely that Billy-the-Kid expects to register about 173 at Friday's weigh-in.

Loop Posts Hoop Rules

Commercial and Church Leagues Ready for Play

While all 18 clubs were practicing diligently in anticipation of the league openers slated for Monday, December 9, directors of the Klamath Basketball conference early this week outlined the rules and by-laws under which the circuit would operate this winter.

Although the Church league, comprising eight teams, and the Commercial loop, composed of 10 teams, will function as separate units, both will be governed by the same rules as set forth by the board of directors headed by Bob Howard, secretary-treasurer of the loop, and Spec Murray, city recreation director.

Copco Withdraws
Murray announced Wednesday that Lost River Dairy will be represented in the Commercial league this season, taking the tenth place in that loop vacated when Copco withdrew its participation Tuesday.

The rules as announced by the board of directors are:
1. Signature of each player, manager and sponsor must be affixed to the entry blank. Any player added to the roster less than seven days previous to the first official league game must sign the roster before being permitted to play. Rosters must be presented to the league secretary seven days before the first official league game.

2. Each team may have a maximum of 10 players. Any player who severs relations with his club may affiliate with another team of lower league percentage standing only after a time lapse of 14 days, subject to approval of the board of directors.

Pay Own Expenses
3. Without exception members of any recognized team not a member of the Klamath Basketball conference, will not be permitted to play in any games sponsored by this league.

4. Teams must pay their own traveling expenses. All gate receipts and other funds derived from games sponsored by the league must be delivered to the league treasurer for bank deposit.

5. Teams must be on the floor ready to play and properly equipped five minutes before the designated starting time. Any team failing to appear with the necessary five men 15 minutes after the designated starting time is subject to forfeiture of the game. Decision in such action is to be made by the referee subject to a ruling of the board of directors.

6. Protest of any game must be made in writing to the board of directors accompanied by a \$5 deposit. Deposit will be refunded to the protesting team after a decision has been made by the board.

Use Lacesless Ball
7. Official league rules will be those set forth by the National Basketball committee in rule book No. 470. Official league ball will be the lacesless type.

8. The board of directors reserves the right to suspend or bar any player found guilty of misconduct during the course of any game sponsored by the league.

9. Participation of league teams against outside attractions will be limited to the three top teams in the Commercial league and the leading team of the Church league at the time of the scheduled attraction.
