

Relish, Canapes, Custard Provide Delicious Snack



Perfect bridge luncheon... relishes and cold sliced chicken. By MRS. GAYNOR MADDOX FOR the bridge or supper party, here are some inexpensive but novel treats.

JELLIED CRANBERRY RELISH (12 half size molds)

One package lemon-flavored gelatin, 1/3 cup sugar, 1 pint hot water, 2 cups raw cranberries, 2 to 3 teaspoons horse-radish.

Dissolve gelatin and sugar in hot water. Chill. Put cranberries through food chopper. When gelatin is slightly thickened, fold in cranberries and horse-radish. Turn into half-sized individual molds. Chill until firm. Can be served with sliced turkey, chicken or other cold cuts.

OLIVE AND ANCHOVY CANAPES

Rounds of bread, butter, anchovy paste, stuffed olives.

Saute rounds of bread 1 inch thick on one side, in butter. Spread the plain side with butter flavored with anchovy paste. Set a slice of pimiento-stuffed olive in the center and a border

into 8 small balls. Place in small roaster or casserole-dish. Pour the tomato soup over the balls and bake, uncovered, for 35 minutes in a 400 degree F. oven. Then cover and bake 35 minutes longer. The rice will swell and give the meat ball a "porcupine" appearance.

BAKED HAM WITH SQUASH

Two cups diced canned ham, 2 cups diced winter squash, salt and pepper, 1 cup brown sugar, 2 tablespoons water.

Place ham in bottom of a baking dish and lay squash on top of ham. Sprinkle with salt, pepper and brown sugar. Add water, cover and bake for 50 minutes in a moderate oven (350 degrees F.). Reduce the heat to 275 degrees F. and continue baking for 25 minutes longer.

CONTRACTS REACH THREE-YEAR PEAK

SEATTLE, Wash., Dec. 6—Engineering contracts let last month reached a total greater than for any month since January, 1938, when the contract was awarded for the completion of Grand Coulee dam, it is revealed in a tabulation to appear in the December issue of Pacific Builder and Engineer, construction trade journal published in Seattle, to be issued next Saturday. The total for 71 contracts awarded in November was \$26,721,914. This is an increase of 240 per cent over the total for November of 1939.

National defense projects accounted for the major portion of these contracts. Army post jobs alone accounted for \$17,977,351. Oregon's outstanding job of this type is the army air corps cantonment buildings at Portland, awarded by the quartermaster corps of the war department to Hauser Construction company and George H. Buckler and Natt McDougall Co., Portland, jointly for \$1,142,000. Other outstanding projects in the national defense program were awarded by the navy department for work in the Bremerton navy yard and on the Alaskan naval air bases.

For the third time in 1940, grading and surfacing contracts passed the million mark, with 18 projects totaling \$1,009,347. Two miles of the Sexton mountain section of the Pacific highway in Josephine county was the outstanding job of this type in Ore-

gon. The contract was awarded to McNitt Brothers, Eugene, for \$236,390.

Marine projects last month amounted to more than 3 million dollars, including the reconstruction of the north jetty, Umpqua river, awarded to Kern and Kibbe, Portland, for \$723,320.

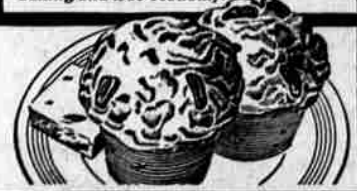

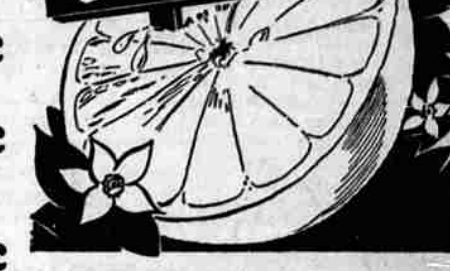

Low Price Meats Help You Save for Christmas

SAVING pennies for Christmas presents? Then these inexpensive meats will help you.

DEVILED FLANK STEAK (Serves 4)

One and one-half pounds of flank steak, 3 tablespoons fat, 1 cup finely diced onion, 2 tablespoons flour, 2 teaspoons salt, 1 teaspoon pepper, 1 teaspoon paprika, 1 teaspoon vinegar, 1 cup tomato sauce, 1 1/2 cups hot water.

Cut the steak into strips, across the grain. Roll strips in flour. Heat the fat and add the onion and steak and brown on all sides. Mix flour, salt, pepper and paprika. Add the vinegar and tomato sauce to the dry ingredients. Pour over steak. Cover tightly and allow it to simmer for 1 hour or until tender. Serve in the center of a large ring mold of rice.
