British Attack Nazi Invasion Points; Il Duce Again Shakes Up Command of Italian Army

German troops in trenches along the Nazi-occupied French and Belgian coasts—presumably awaiting Adolf Hitler's signal to invade England—were reported today to have been machine-gunned by British warplanes in low-flying attacks, while other RAF raiders bombed Nazi-occupied bases and pounded the Italian cities of Venice, Turin and Cantania.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 13 (AP)—The administration won today the first congressional skirmish over its lease-lend bill for aiding Britain when the house upheld procedure charted by the leadership for rushing consideration of the measure.

AFL STANDING ON RIGHT TO STRIKE

Labor Willing to Make Sacrifices for Defense, Claim

WASHINGTON, Jan. 13 (AP)—The American Federation of Labor gave congress today that it would fight any attempt to legislate away labor's "right to strike" in defense production.

Greeks Attack

On the Albanian war front, a dispatch from an Associated Press correspondent with the Greek counter-invasion armies said Greek shock troops were impeding the Italian defense line beyond Klisura, in central Albania, and that the Greek advance was so rapid that unburied dead "still litter the battlefield."

Hearings Stated

The vote was taken without debate, house rules permitting no argument on such an issue. The billoting was the first involving the British-aid bill introduced in the new congress Friday. The measure cleared the way for Chairman Bloom (D-N.Y.) of the foreign affairs committee to commence hearings tomorrow with Secretary Hull as the first witness.

LINER GROUNDED ON FLORIDA SAND

WEST PALM BEACH, Fla., Jan. 13 (AP)—Some of the 200 passengers were transferred from the grounded liner Manhattan to the coast guard cutter Vigilante today although surf swells interfered at least temporarily with plans to take off all of them in small boats.

Farrell Wins Speaker Gavel in Caucus As 41st Oregon Legislature Session Opens

SALEM, Jan. 3 (AP)—The 41st Oregon legislative assembly organized without incident today, the wounds of the bitter speakership fight having been healed in last night's caucus.

SPEAKING of troubles:

ZURICH, SWITZERLAND, Jan. 13 (AP)—James Joyce, Irish author whose novel "Ulysses" touched off world-wide literary controversy and influenced a new school of writing, died early today in a Zurich hospital where he had undergone an intestinal operation.

Warrant Issued For Princess

WASHINGTON, Jan. 13 (AP)—The justice department announced today a deportation warrant had been issued and would be served immediately upon Princess Waldenburg of Hungary.

McCloud Workman Injured in Crash Early Sunday

John Jones, 25, employee of the McCloud River Lumber company at McCloud, Calif., is in a semi-conscious condition at Klamath Valley hospital as the result of an automobile accident which occurred early Sunday morning on the Keno road.

Supreme Court Upholds Two Spy Convictions

WASHINGTON, Jan. 13 (AP)—The supreme court upheld today the conviction of two men—one a citizen of Russia and the other a Russian-born naturalized American—on a charge of violating federal anti-spy legislation by obtaining information from United States naval intelligence files.

British Halt French Vessel

MONTEVIDEO, Uruguay, Jan. 13 (AP)—Foreign office sources reported today that the 800-ton French merchantman Mendoza, which left here last night in an attempt to run the British blockade, had taken shelter in Maldonado bay, east of Montevideo, after signalling she had been chased by a British warship.

Klamath Rejects "Pork Barrel" Plans For Improvement of Defense Highways

Two Shot in Ecuador Riots

QUITO, Ecuador, Jan. 13 (AP)—Many arrests were made today and strong forces of military police were held in readiness for new outbreaks following a bloody clash in which two rioters were shot dead, 17 others wounded and 13 policemen hurt.
