

'GOOSE NEST' RENAMED FOR WAR VETERAN

Goose Nest butte is no more. The board of geographical names, department of the interior, has selected the name of Hardin butte for the 4489-foot promontory located four miles from the north entrance of Lava Beds national monument, and formerly known by old-timers as Goose Nest butte.

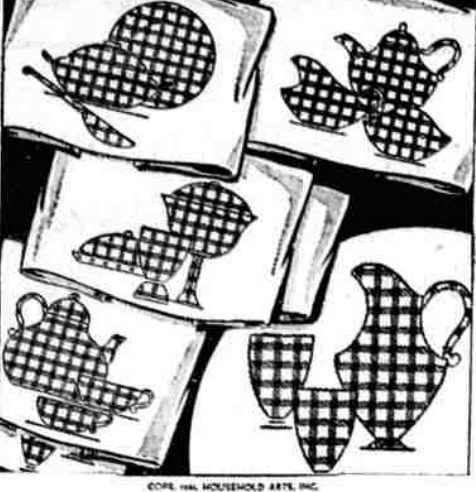
During the Modoc war the point was referred to as Gravelly butte because of the gravel found there.

Hardin butte was the destination of the Thomas Wright detachment of troops sent out April 26, 1873, by Colonel Alvin Gillem to locate the Indians after they had left the stronghold. As a result this party was attacked by the Modocs and every man who stayed to fight was either wounded or killed, including four officers and 16 enlisted men, killed and two officers and 13 men wounded, some of these dying later.

Charles B. Hardin, member of the relief expedition sent in to rescue Wright's men under command of Colonel John Green, was the first to discover the battlefield. He came upon the scene at night, it was said. Young Hardin was then a member of Troop G, First Cavalry.

In 1927, Major Hardin visited the Lava beds and located the site of the battlefield. He was an instructor at Oregon State college at the time and had risen from the rank of private to major. He died in 1940, in Denver, Colorado.

JAPAN MOVE NEAR, REPORTER STATES

PORTLAND, Jan. 21 (AP) — Hallett Abend, veteran foreign newspaper correspondent, said Saturday that the southern section of the orient is arming against expected invasion by Japan.

"The people of Malaya, Java, and all the island territories, including the Philippines, are girding themselves against possible surprise attacks by the Japanese," he asserted.

The New York Times correspondent was among 45 passengers aboard the liner Jagersfontein which docked here Saturday from the orient.

He said that because of numerous attempts to assassinate him, American authorities had advised him to leave Japanese-occupied lands.

Last July two Japanese invaded his Shanghai apartment and seized 354 typewritten pages of manuscript, the start of his book on General Frederick Townsend Ward, founder of the ever victorious army of China.

VISIBILITY LOW AT CRATER LAKE

Tuesday was no day for visitors at Crater Lake national park where the visibility was reported at zero, according to radio communication received by Don C. Fisher, ranger, in charge of park offices here.

One inch of new snow fell during the night, making a total depth of 114 inches at headquarters. Those who do not plan to continue to the rim will see the park in all its winter glory and the ride is excellent as two-way traffic is possible and chains are not required. Skiing is but "fair," Fisher stated. Fourteen inches of very dry, loose snow, covers the normal pack.

COUNCIL AWARDS BUILDING PERMIT

Acting on a recommendation from the building code board of appeals, the city council Monday night voted to permit Donald L. Sloan to construct a multiple dwelling on property at California avenue and Cook street.

The board said that Sloan's proposed building involves certain technical violations of the ordinance, but none of any practical consequence.

OVER 1000 DEER ENTER LAVA BEDS

With snow covering the hills surrounding the Lava Beds national monument, and the monument itself remaining remarkably clear, between 1000 and 1200 mule deer and a few black tail, have arrived to spend the remainder of the winter, according to information from Don C. Fisher, custodian. The south end of the monument is reserved for winter range for the deer.

Some 6000 sheep are now grazing in the north half of the monument and bands of 1500 each are being run by Jerry Murphy, Hugh O'Connor, Dennis O'Connor, John and Jerry O'Connor.

Members of the Lava Beds CCC camp are now at work on construction of the north boundary road from the camp to Canby's cross.

Monday was an exceptionally beautiful day in the monument, bright sunshine throughout the morning and afternoon. All roads are in "first class shape," Fisher stated.

FATHER 'IMPRISONED'; BROKE BABY'S LEG

MARSHALL, Mich., Jan. 21 (AP)—For breaking the leg of his 9-month-old son when he became annoyed over the baby's crying, Jay Theron Rutledge, 23-year-old Battle Creek WPA worker, was sentenced to serve 4 1/2 to 5 years in prison.

Rutledge pleaded guilty in circuit court to a formal charge of cruelly and unlawfully punishing a child. Circuit Judge Blaine W. Hatch told the father that his act of twisting the infant's leg until it broke was "inhuman."

Rutledge was arrested after the baby was taken to a hospital for treatment. His wife, Eva, 27, was in court when sentence was pronounced. The couple has an older child.

GEORGIA RECRUITS TO ARRIVE FRIDAY

Lieutenant George Morton, commander of the Lava Beds CCC camp, announced Tuesday 118 recruits would arrive at the camp January 24, bringing the camp strength to 210 men.
