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string of air bases by this country and the creation of an air force of about 10,000 first line planes and an equal number of reserves, exclusive of trainers. Such a force, he said, would "insure American security."

Exports Mistake

But, he told inquiring committee members, the United States now has nowhere near this air force. It is "a mistake" to export warplanes when this country has such a lack of them, he added. "A share of fighting craft, estimated at 50 to 60 per cent or more, is now going to Britain as fast as the ships are produced."

Lindbergh also told Rep. Vorys (R-Ohio) that military planes would not become obsolete in future as rapidly as they have in the past because they are now approaching what appears to be an airplane's probable top speed of 500 miles an hour.

Vorys asked the witness whether this country's policy of "partial help" had made it an "object of contempt" in England. Lindbergh said he thought that was "partially true" and added, "we encouraged England to declare war to a partial extent."

Greeks Report Two-way Attack

ATHENS, Jan. 23 (AP) — A two-way attack on Italian objectives in the Greek war theater — military buildings and transport concentrations in Albania and the airbase of Maritza on the Dodecanese island of Rhodes — was reported today by the British royal air force.

The assault on Maritza, one of the few actions thus far against Italians in the Dodecanese islands, caused fires among military buildings at the airport last night, the communique said.

Royal air force headquarters reported heavy raids Monday night on Derna, 85 miles west of Tobruk. The bombs started fires which the RAF said would be seen 80 miles away. Derna would be the immediate major objective of a British drive farther along the Libyan coast.

Barracks "and other military targets" were hit by tons of bombs, the communique said.

ROME, Jan. 2 (AP) — The Italian high command announced today that a vastly superior force of British troops had occupied portions of the Libyan stronghold of Tobruk after suffering "especially severe losses" inflicted by the Italian defenders.

The Italians reported, however, that their troops still were offering "strenuous resistance" in some positions to the west of the town.

'BEAM' EYED IN LOCAL VIEW OF HUNT FOR BOMBER

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might have run into a snowstorm and turned west on the beam in an effort to fly across the mountains to the Medford airport.

West of Klamath lake the snow would have encountered snow-covered mountain peaks hidden by the overcast and averaging from 8000 to 9000 feet in elevation. Aspen butte, Pelican butte, Mount McLoughlin and other high peaks reach into the air on either side of the beam.

Originating at the Medford range station just north of Medford on the Crater Lake highway, the main beam extends eastward as far as Bly. At a point just above Fish lake it is intersected by a shorter landing beam.

Weather Bad

Records at the Klamath airport kept for the local C.A.A. program show that airplanes were able to fly in this section last Thursday morning, but that at noon the ceiling closed in and planes were being kept on the ground by adverse weather conditions, about the time the bomber would have reached this area. The Varney creek section,

where John Coumans, a rancher, reported he saw a low flying plane last Thursday afternoon, is covered by approximately five feet of snow. Since the plane's disappearance new snow has increased the depth by one or possibly two feet, local sheriff's officers reported.

The country in that sector is extremely rugged. Deep, drifting snow would hamper searches.

While light army bombers which have been used to search southern Washington and northern Oregon were being held for

better flying conditions before being transferred to the Medford port, the war department announced that the search would be concentrated in this section and in northern California.

Reports from Medford stated that a large ship was seen last Thursday over the Sawyer Har section on the south side of the Siskiyou mountains on Klamath river 40 miles west of Yreka, Calif.

The hunt was being continued, meanwhile, in the Mount Rainier section of Washington.
