LEADERS AGAIN SUFFER DIP IN STOCK MARKET

NEW YORK, Jan. 30 (AP)—Leading stocks suffered another relapse in today's market when an early feeble rally failed to elicit any broad buying response.

Steadying trends in steels, motors and rails at the start were attributed to the belief the list may have been "oversold." On average it had been up slightly only twice since January 10, and yesterday's sharp fall, some hoped, had substantially bettered the technical base.

Prices began to fade before midday as Hitler's speech came over the news tickers. It was debatable, brokers said, as to just how much of a depressing influence the fuhrer's verbal blast had on speculative sentiment. Some nervous holders, it was suggested, possibly stood aside because of the thought the Nazi leader apparently exhibited more assurance of victory than in his other diatribes.

Transfers were around 700,000 shares.

Prominent on the downward shift were U. S. Steel, Bethlehem, Youngstown Sheet, Chrysler, U. S. Rubber, Sears Roebuck, Montgomery Ward, Anaconda, Kennecott, American Smelting, Phelps Dodge, N. Y. Central, Du Pont, Union Carbide, Johns-Manville, Eastman Kodak and U. S. Gypsum.

Rails, utilities and aircrafts were relatively narrow.

Bonds and commodities were irregularly lower.

Weakness of securities in New York appeared to be a dominating factor in the late sell-off. Some "spreading" operations were reported in which Chicago wheat was sold and simultaneous purchases made in other markets.

Wheat rallied fractionally above the low prices for the day and at the close was 1/2 cent below yesterday's finish.
