

Alaskan Youth Lost Overboard On Seattle Trip

SEATTLE, Feb. 13 (AP)—Lee Ray, about 20, son of a Seward, Alaska, attorney, was lost overboard from the steamship Alaska as it was nearing Seattle early today.

Line officials said Ray was acting as a guard, assisting Deputy U. S. Marshal Irwin Metcalf, Seward, who was taking several persons to a hospital for the insane at Moringside, Ore. Metcalf and his charges continued from here by train.

A lookout in the Alaska's forepeak reported a man overboard about 2 a. m. The ship was stopped and a boat put over and the crew searched several hours off Jefferson Head, Kitsap county.

Meanwhile it was discovered Ray was missing. His luggage was intact in his stateroom, and Capt. O. C. Anderson, master of the Alaska, said Ray was in good spirits when last seen.

Air Reserve Pilot Killed

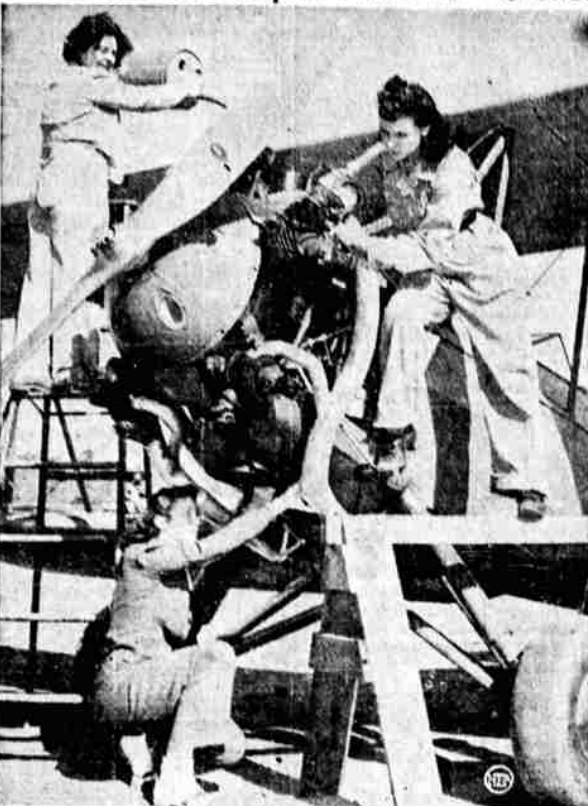
BALBOA, C. Z., Feb. 13 (AP)—Second Lieut. John Kepling Fisher, of the United States air reserves, was killed today when his pursuit plane crashed into the mud flats at Chame point during combat maneuvers.
