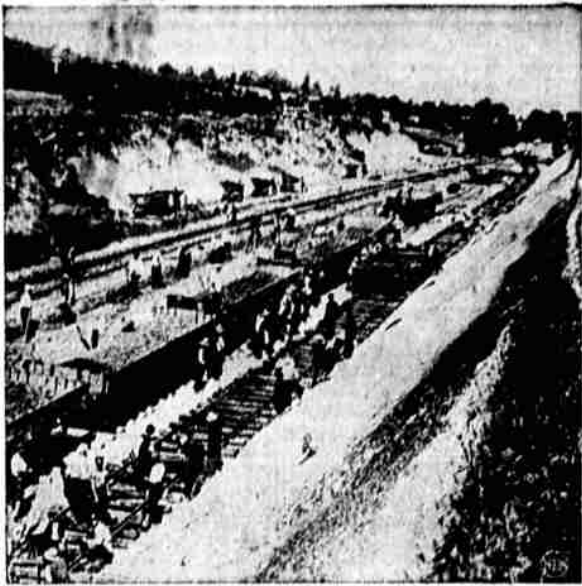


INTER-COUNTY VISITS URGED FOR LEADERS

Veteran Newsmen Of West Dies at Age of 92 Years

TACOMA, Wash., Feb. 20 (AP) John A. Rea, aged 92, retired newspaperman, one time regent of the University of Washington and until his death the oldest living graduate of Cornell university, died at his home here today. As a correspondent, he covered the American Indian war in 1877, traveling with United States cavalry that pursued Chief Joseph across Montana. He received his A. B. degree from Cornell university in 1889.

He entered newspaper work as a reporter for the Philadelphia press. Later, he was managing editor of the Minneapolis Tribune and also served as editor of the Bismarck, North Da-

kota Tribune and of the Dakota edition of the St. Paul Pioneer Press. He came to Washington in 1890 and for a time served as editor of the Daily Olympian of Olympia.

He was president emeritus of the board of regents of the University of Washington, was a member of Phi Beta Kappa fraternity and was one of the founders of New York Alpha chapter of Phi Kappa Psi fraternity.
