STOCK MARKET FAILS TO KEEP RALLY STRIDE

NEW YORK, Feb. 21 (AP) — The worst that could be said of today's stock market was that it generally failed to follow through on Thursday's sharp rally, while on its credit side was the fact it retained most of yesterday's advance and even added modest amounts in many cases.

Transfers of around 300,000 shares again were among the slowest for a five-hour stretch in nearly six months and compared with better than 450,000 the day before.

Other favorable performers the greater part of the time were Sears Roebuck, Montgomery Ward, American Telephone, Du Pont, Allied Chemical, Union Pacific, Pennsylvania, Douglas Aircraft, Glenn Martin and General Electric.

In the faltering division were U. S. Steel, Bethlehem, Chrysler, Santa Fe, Great Northern, American Can, Anaconda, Western Union, North American, Public Service of N. J., Woolworth and Johns-Manville.

Bonds were uneven with rails in moderate demand.

Santa Anita Contenders Race Saturday

LOS ANGELES, Feb. 21 (AP) Rain or shine, top ranking contenders for the \$100,000 Santa Anita handicap race tomorrow in the final big race before setting out after the rich pot of gold at Santa Anita park.

Entries were awaited today for the running of the \$10,000 San Antonio handicap tomorrow. Most of the horse observers believed that William L. Brann's Chaledon and his chief rival for the fat purse, Charles S. Howard's Midland, would be named in the mile and one sixteenth event.

Heavy rains all week has thoroughly soaked the track, but a fine field of stake contenders was anticipated.

With interest mounting as the big handicap approaches, a throng of 25,000 or more is expected to witness tomorrow's event. Seabiscuit signalled his form by winning last year and then coming back to capture the Santa Anita the week following.

BLIZZARDS FAIL TO REDUCE SALES

NEW YORK, Feb. 21 (AP)—Despite blizzards in some parts of the nation which tended to slow buying, retail sales this week continued to breeze along at average year high levels, and averaged 12 to 20 per cent above the like 1940 week for the country as a whole, Dun & Bradstreet reported today.

The mercantile agency found increases in both retailing and wholesale trade. Said the agency: "Less favorable weather conditions for the promotion of new seasonal merchandise failed to dim glowing sales reports from retail stores."
