Bufano Statue Bewilders University of California

BERKELEY, Calif., Feb. 21 (UP)—The Daily Californian, student newspaper at the University of California, today had a genuine Beniamino Bufano original statue parked behind the copy desk, but nobody was quite sure what to do with it.

Bufano, whose work ranges from the sculpture of heroic mountain-top colossae to the delivery of morning newspapers, gave his three-foot statue of a bear to the Californian because the university's symbol is the golden bear.

Bufano said it was an abstraction of a grizzly bear, but he had opposition. The creature, standing on four flat feet, had a beaver tail, a seal-like body, deer-like ears and a bear-like snout, with four jagged teeth.

Faculty members came over from the art department and condemned it enthusiastically. Professor Eugen Neuhaus said he was disgusted.

Plans for an unveiling were held in abeyance pending determination of the wisdom of such an act.

Bufano, acknowledged one of the world's greatest contemporary sculptors, has been embroiled in many art disputes because of his radical style. He once carved a crucifix with Christ's trigger finger missing. His proposed giant St. Francis

for the top of San Francisco's twin peaks was described by Columnist Westbrook Pegler as a combination of a village water tower and the guest of honor at a holdup. His great statue of Dr. Sun Yat Sen, in San Francisco's Chinatown, is of stainless steel except for the red marble head and hands.

BERLIN, Feb. 21 (AP)—Dienst Aus Deutschland, a source close to German officials, said today that Nazi submarines were sinking comparatively few British ships because "many of the (U-boat) crews now are engaged in preparation for the big offensive which Hitler proclaimed."

(The commentary's reference apparently was to the fuhrer's January 30 speech on the eighth anniversary of his rise to power.

"At sea, U-boat warfare will begin this spring, and our opponent will realize there also that we haven't slept.")

the administration regards the tense far eastern situation as something made in Germany.

The administration, in the opinion of these legislators, has reason to think that Berlin has been exerting pressure to get Japan into the present war and then embroiled with the United States in the far east in order to hamper the British aid program.

The interpretation of the recent abrupt turn of events in the Orient was one reason, it was reported, why the decision was taken to dispatch immediately a number of the latest army and navy planes to reinforce American air strength at Pacific bases.

Greeks Repeat Appeal for Aid

WASHINGTON, Feb. 21 (AP)—The Greek government, it was learned today, has made a second urgent appeal to the United States for help—particularly for warplanes—"before it is too late."

The result has been to start defense officials on a fresh canvass of available supplies in search of aircraft that can be spared to reinforce the Greeks in their struggle with the Italians.

Greece's renewed plea for the assistance promised by President Roosevelt some time ago reached here during the last several days. It arrived just before the signing this week of the Turco-Bulgarian non-aggression pact which may alter the Balkan status quo and exert a decisive effect on the military and political future of Greece.

If Eugene does not obtain the convention, the money would be returned to the state.

Saturday Set for Vet Registration

Saturday is the day set for registration of world war veterans for possible national defense. Registration offices will be open at the Legion hall from 9 until 4 p. m.

A total of 28 questions will be asked veterans who register.

Britain Flying U. S. Planes West

WASHINGTON, Feb. 21 (AP)—The British embassy announced today that "aircraft are being flown" to its forces in the Far East from the west coast of the United States.

Although indicating that powerful bomber reinforcements were being sent to the British at Singapore, the embassy declined to give any further details.

"We can say nothing about the numbers, types, or routes of these aircraft," an official said.

FAILURE CHARGED

MOSCOW, Feb. 21 (AP)—The communist party removed former Foreign Commissar Maxim Litvinoff and four others from the party's central committee today for "failing their duties" and warned the heads of seven commissariats that similar action would be taken against them unless their work "improves."
