

GRANGERS EYE SPUD DIVERSION AT MEET HERE

Eighteen representatives of the Henley, Midland, Shasta, Lost River, Poe valley, Hildebrand, Fort Klamath and Merrill granges met at the county agent's office on Monday, March 3, in their regular monthly meeting. Subjects coming up for discussion were, the potato feed diversion program now in operation in the Klamath basin, value of potatoes as a livestock feed, the appointment of a business agent in each grange of the county, setting of a meeting date by the Pomona grange master for a meeting of said business agents, rodent control, weeds, potato estimates, pastures, mustard seed production and other matters of interest to farmers of this area.

It was pointed out that potatoes are valuable as a livestock feed and generally are worth not less than one-fourth as much as barley for this purpose. Cooking is best in feeding to hogs and chopping for cattle is generally advised. Other forms of livestock can take them as is. With the feed diversion program in operation, the location of sources of feed potatoes so diverted to livestock was considered an important matter, if full advantage of the diversion program is to be secured.

Harold Schieferstein, county pest control supervisor, called attention to the fact that the squirrel poisoning season is here and active poisoning should be undertaken as soon as squirrels appear. Poisoned oats are now being prepared and are to be distributed to all stores in the county who usually handle it. Trapping was also considered an excellent means of gopher and mole control although prepared baits if properly put out were effective on gophers, and oat groats were effective on field mice.

Farmers were cautioned against purchasing feed or seed grains containing noxious weed seeds. It was pointed out that such seeds are not eligible for sale under the Oregon law.

Relative to potato estimates it was pointed out that the bureau of crop and livestock estimates maintains reporters throughout all farming areas and that reports published originate from estimates given by these reporters. Discussion of pastures indicated that good pastures properly put in were eligible to AAA payments and generally produce much more pasture than old pastures commonly grown in this area.

Woman Injured On Highway 66

Mrs. S. W. Butler was injured slightly Saturday at 12:30 p. m. when she was struck by a car driven by Ralph Brenaman, 521 North Tenth street, Brenaman reported Tuesday to the sheriff's office.

The incident occurred on highway 66 near Keno. Brenaman said. As he rounded a curve a car in front was stopping. He said he applied his brakes to stop, but that the car slid sideways, striking Mrs. Butler.

COLUMBIA, La., March 5 (AP)—William Heard received a letter from the circulation department of a Little Rock, Ark., newspaper advising him that his subscription would expire on March 8.

Heard replied yesterday, in part:

"I wish to inform you that if you read your paper as closely as I do . . . you would know that I will be hung on March 7 . . . In view of the fact that I do not know my future address I am afraid our pleasant relations must be severed . . ."

Heard is one of the four convicts who escaped from Cummins, Ark., prison last Labor day and later were sentenced to hang for the killing of Frank Gattman, a posse member, near here. The four will be hanged here Friday, March 7.

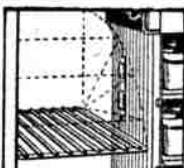
