

KLAMATH EGG RAISERS HEAR EXPERTS TALK

Sixty-five egg producers Tuesday night heard an explanation of the state egg law by Bryant Williams, inspector for the state department of agriculture. Production and maintenance of egg quality were discussed by N. L. Bennion, extension poultry specialist, Oregon State college. Over 100 people learned something about egg grades and saw eggs candled at the meeting or throughout the day.

Bennion pointed out that Oregon's extensive egg industry has been built on quality and showed that maintenance of Klamath's poultry industry or expansion of it to fill needs of consumers in the county depends largely on quality production and quality maintenance after the eggs are laid. He stated that such egg quality factors as thickness of albumen, size of egg, uniformity of egg size and shape, and shell texture have been proven to be inherited characteristics and that egg quality improvement is definitely tied to breeding.

In general, feeding has little influence on egg quality. A well-balanced ration which gives good production also gives good egg quality. Color of yolk, however, is influenced by green feeds and yellow corn. However, if not more than 5 per cent of the ration is green feed or alfalfa meal and not more than 25 per cent yellow corn, yolk will not be excessively dark, according to Bennion. Best quality of eggs are produced by hens confined to laying houses. Small flocks running loose with access to weeds and refuse may produce at least some off-flavor eggs. Flavors are also very easily absorbed by eggs and care should be exercised in storage.

Quality maintenance is probably the most important factor in egg production, handling and distribution through stores. Bennion said "an egg six weeks old may be fresher than one six days old. Temperature and humidity affect quality very rapidly. Experiments in egg storage show 63 per cent grade AA eggs at the end of six days when properly stored as compared to 34 per cent with less favorable storage and 23 per cent with ordinary feed room storage. Temperatures of not more than 65 degrees and humidity over 80 per cent are necessary for maintenance of quality for lengths of time over six or seven days."

Egg producers at the meeting discussed the desirability of adoption of better egg handling in retail stores. Eggs need as much care as milk or butter. It was stated that consumers would get better egg quality from stores if eggs were handled from refrigerator cases like milk or butter. The housewife who buys grade AA or grade A eggs can expect them not to spread all over the pan when broken. Eggs which are AA or A when packed may not be that grade a week later unless properly cared for.

Proper care includes production of clean eggs—frequent gathering, rapid cooling and farm and store storage at low temperatures and high humidity.

Jehovahs Plead Innocent to Flag Salute Charges

MOSCOW, Ida., March 13 (U.P.) Five self-identified members of the Jehovah's Witnesses religious sect pleaded innocent Wednesday to charges of refusing to salute the American flag.

Their spokesman, E. C. Kennedy, petitioned Judge Ray Carter for a jury trial. The judge set the trial for Monday.

The group was arrested on charges of failing to comply with a recently-passed city ordinance which provides that permits to distribute printed matter will be given only to those who salute the flag and take an oath of allegiance.

Gay Vienna of Old Revived Briefly During Celebration

VIENNA, March 13 (U.P.) — Vienna's theatres, beer halls and night clubs did a rushing business Wednesday night on the third anniversary of Adolf Hitler's Anschluss that revived for a few hours the gay Vienna of old.

Three years after the death of independent Austria and its metamorphosis into Ostmark — Germany's "east province" — it seemed to be better off in many material ways than it was then.

Unemployment has been wiped out. Infant mortality has been cut. Real wages have not decreased. Grumbling is to be heard today in Vienna, but it is not taken seriously.

Only the famous coffee houses have declined since the Anschluss, and the owners report that even they have noticed business picking up again in recent months.

Births Doubled

The birth rate was shot up. Baby carriages are in great demand. Their profusion in the parks around the Ringstrasse on sunny days must be seen to be believed. It is an impressive manifestation of reports that the birth rate has more than doubled since 1937.

Since the Nazi legions moved in on March 12, 1938, Ostmark has been used for some administrative experiments. A scheme whereby the office of procurator for Reich affairs and that of Nazi party gauleiter were vested in one person was tried in Vienna for the first time.

Elimination of Jews from public life and businesses progressed comparatively more rapidly in Ostmark than elsewhere in the Reich. An estimated 50,000 Jews still are in Vienna, but the majority of them are expected to

HAYDEN TO GO TO SOUTH LAND MEET

B. E. Hayden, superintendent of the Klamath project, US bureau of reclamation, will leave Friday for Indio, Calif., to attend a meeting of a board of review standards of land classification on the Gila project of Arizona, and the All-American canal in the Imperial valley.

Serving with Hayden in the classification of California properties is Professor W. W. Weir of the division of soils, University of California, and Masey W. Lapham of Berkeley, senior soil scientist, division of soil survey, bureau of plant industry of the US department of agriculture. The meeting is scheduled to start Monday and continue for three or four days.

Taking the place of Professor Weir on Arizona land classification will be H. V. Smith of the college of agriculture, University of Arizona, Tucson.

Purpose of the meeting is to adopt standards of soil classifications for projects, to be followed later by Earl R. Fogarty, US bureau of reclamation soil engineer, who will proceed in making soil surveys of all areas, Hayden stated.

AGENT ORDERS LAST SUPPLY OF TREES

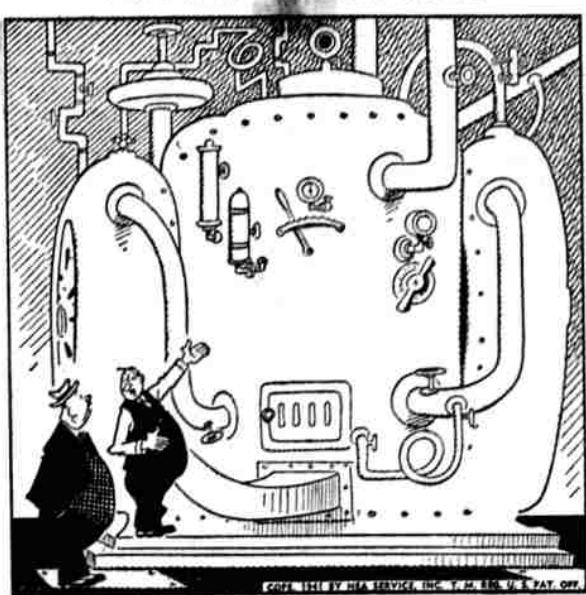
The last order for seedling trees from the Oregon Forest nursery was placed with that department Tuesday, March 10. Owing to the advanced season no general orders will be placed after this date but anyone desiring trees for farm use, as provided by law, can get information on ordering from the county agent's office. It should be borne in mind by all people ordering trees that section 4 of the federal Clarke-McNary law, provided for distribution of planting stock to the farmers of the state, reads as follows:

Section 4. The secretary of agriculture is hereby authorized and directed to cooperate with the various states in the procurement, production and distribution of forest-tree seeds and plants, for the purpose of establishing windbreaks, shelterbelts, and farm woodlots upon denuded or non-forested lands with such cooperating states, under such conditions and requirements as he may prescribe to the end that forest tree seeds or plants so procured, produced or distributed shall be used effectively for planting denuded or non-forested lands in the cooperating states and growing timber thereon.

The state board of forestry has entered a contract with the secretary of agriculture which definitely states that the stock shall be used only for the purposes indicated in the law. Growers securing this stock certify that the trees shall be used only in the establishing of shelterbelts, woodlots or windbreaks and further agree that excess stock shall not be redistributed except with the approval of the state forester. Any and all sales or unauthorized distribution of this stock is forbidden under severe penalty.

Detectives W. G. Baird and Mearns Bateman took him to a nearby all-night cafe and while Gates was consuming several hamburger sandwiches, he told

the officers he had committed a number of burglaries here and in San Diego.

Gates to his hotel room and he turned over to them a suitcase containing several guns, jewelry and other valuables which he said he obtained in the various robberies.

"I hope they give me a good long stretch," he told the officers. "It will do me a world of good."

Young Gates identified himself as the stepson of the prominent Seattle attorney, saying that the elder Gates had adopted him as his own son when he was a child.

"I guess I just made a mess of things," he said. "My father sent me to private schools and gave me the best of everything but I just didn't turn out right."

When he surrendered himself, the youth had only four cents in his pocket.

"It's a very funny feeling to have only four cents in your pocket and to be expecting a policeman to tap you on the shoulder at any minute. Four

cents won't even buy a cup of coffee.

Cassius Gates is a member of the Seattle law firm of Bogle, Bogle and Gates, which numbers among its clients the American Mail Line. Gates was reported on vacation at present in Chandler, Ariz.

Young Gates was held on suspicion of burglary charges in city jail while officers checked on the residences he told them he had robbed in recent months.
