Vinson Seeks Anti-Strike Legislation

WASHINGTON, March 13 (AP)—Chairman Vinson (D-Ga.) of the house naval committee, asserting that strikes in defense industries had cost enough man-hours of labor to manufacture 325 modern bombers, asked today for quick congressional approval of legislation to eliminate work stoppages.

He made his request to the house judiciary committee investigating defense labor problems while advocating bills to create new machinery for adjustment of labor disputes and to permit men to work without being compelled to join labor unions.

At the same time he discarded as impractical proposals to eliminate strikes advanced by Robert Patterson, assistant secretary of war, and William S. Knudsen, director of the office of production management.

Patterson's plan for another war labor board would not work, because of the split in the labor movement, Vinson said, and Knudsen's suggestion for enforcement of arbitration decisions by denying Wagner act rights to both employer and worker would be "impractical."

Scouting Float Planned for Campaign Parade

A float bearing displays of scouting activities will be the feature of the Boy Scout-Girl Scout-Campfire Girls parade which on Saturday, March 22, will break open the third annual fund financing drive.

According to Matt Finnigan of the parade committee the float will include a signalling display by Troop 4, a communications exhibit by Troop 3 and a first aid display by Troop 1.

U. S. Freezes Hungry Funds

WASHINGTON, March 13 (AP)—President Roosevelt today "froze" all funds of Hungary in the United States.

Treasury Secretary Morgenthau said that the president and the treasury acted at the request of the state department, but declined to discuss the reasons.

Hungary, the 12th nation whose funds have been frozen, signed the axis pact about two months ago. Customarily such freezing orders have been issued when nations were occupied by troops of another country. Morgenthau declined to say whether the action meant that the United States now considered Hungary occupied by German troops.

Bomb Toll Four At Istanbul

ISTANBUL, Turkey, March 13 (AP)—Teresa Armstrong, 23-year-old stenographer of the British legation in Sofia, died early today.

Her death brought to four the number of dead in the suitcase bomb attempt on the life of George W. Rendel, British minister to Bulgaria.

Miss Armstrong was so seriously injured in the explosion in the Pera Palace hotel that both her legs had to be amputated.
