BAIRD TO SPEAK AT C. E. CONCLAVE

The Reverend Jesse Hays Baird, D. D., president of the San Francisco Theological seminary, will be one of the main speakers at the Oregon State Christian Endeavor convention which will take place in this city April 24-27.

Dr. Baird is one of the outstanding leaders of the Presbyterian church in the U.S.A. today. He has always been particularly interested in young people and has taken an active part in furthering their organizations. He has spoken for many conferences, conventions, societies and on college campuses.

He has been an international trustee of Christian Endeavor since 1935 and in 1940 was one of the principal speakers in the International Christian Endeavor convention in Cleveland, Ohio. Dr. Baird has written much of the material which is used in Presbyterian Sunday school lessons, including "Church membership and the Church," "Great Christian Leaders," and "Christians Everyday." He also contributes to "Today" and other church periodicals and is the author of "God's Law of Life."

Dr. Baird received his A.B. as well as his D.D. from the College of Wooster. He was granted a B.D. from McCormick Theological seminary. He has served churches in Rexburg and St. Anthony, Idaho; Youngstown, Ohio; Boise, Idaho; Pomona, Calif.; Salt Lake City, Utah; and the First Church, Oakland, Calif., from which he was called to the chair of practical theology and the presidency of San Francisco Theological seminary. He is a member of Phi Beta Kappa, Chi Alpha, and Rotary International.
