

STORE OPENS AFTER MOVING, REMODELING

Invited to an open house Friday night in the new, streamlined home of Rickys Credit Jewelers at the downtown corner of Seventh and Main streets, Klamath Falls Friday afternoon got their first glimpse of the shining shop which has been in the making behind a high board wall for the past weeks.

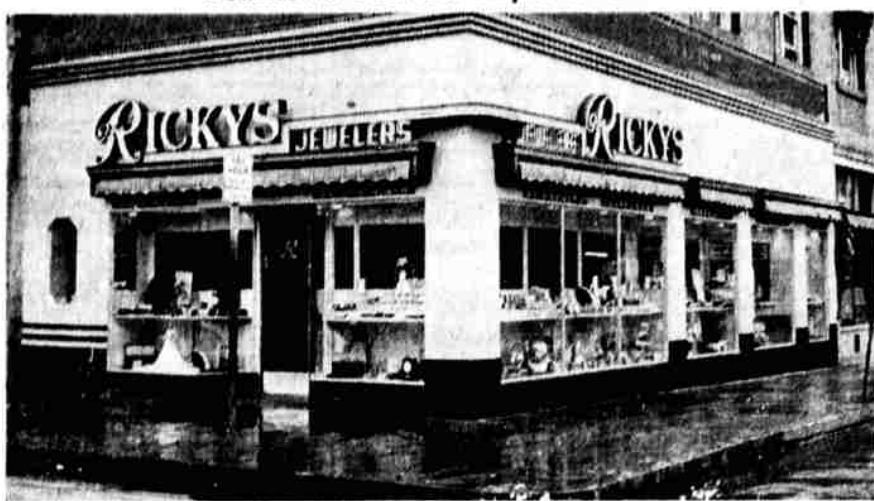
Doors will be open for business Saturday morning but lighting, furnishing, and stocking were to be complete for a public inspection of the new two-story store by Friday.

The jeweler's new location, which once housed the Schuss Vintage company, has been entirely remodeled inside and out with Klamath-built products. Feature for perspiring summer shoppers is the announcement that it will be completely air-conditioned through the whole year.

On first glance the outstanding part of the new colorful corner is its exterior but closer inspection shows the interior, which has been termed the best-lighted in the entire city, is perhaps even more extraordinary. Finished in light green and white with Philippine mahogany showcases, the shop is equipped with double panel window glass which permits a maximum of natural daylight.

Augmenting old man sunshine are batteries of fluorescent lights and six tiny spots directed from the ceiling. Downstairs a combination of daylight fluorescence and yellow walls gives the

appearance of natural sunlight.

The main floor has been devoted to jewelry lines and a large credit desk in the rear. Overhead is additional balcony office space. Electric household appliances, radios, refrigerators, and washing machines will be carried downstairs.

A new machine-posting book-keeping setup will prevent delays for credit customers, the store has announced.

Democrats Heave Sigh of Relief At Cancellation

WASHINGTON, March 28 (AP)—Democratic leaders heaved a sigh of relief today over the "postponement" of tomorrow night's \$100-a-plate Jackson day dinner here because of President Roosevelt's inability to attend in person.

They had a bad few hours, however, fearful that the president's absence would turn the

main event in the nationwide series of party rallies into a flop.

When the local dinner was arranged, it was believed that Mr. Roosevelt would attend as usual, so some thousands persons accepted "invitations" with that expectation. As soon as word arrived yesterday that the president would not be back, however, the normally brisk last-minute acceptances fell off sharply, and officials with tickets started turning them over to minor employees.

The democratic national committee stepped in late in the day with the announcement that the dinner here would be postponed and held at a later date, rather than disappoint the expectations of those with "invitations."

The other dinners—\$50 affairs in New York and \$25 in other states—will be held as scheduled, with President Roosevelt addressing them by radio from his vacation yacht Potomac in southern waters between 9:30 and 10 p. m. (EST.)

Those who have pledged \$100

to attend the Washington dinner will either listen to the president in their homes, wait for the postponed dinner to be held, or count their pledges as "dinnerless" contributions to the party campaign chest.

Ten Killed in African Crash

CAPETOWN, Union of South Africa, March 28 (AP)—Rear Admiral G. W. Hallifax, former secretary to Lord Clarendon when the latter was governor-general of the Union of South Africa, and nine other persons were killed today in a plane accident in Cape Province.

Admiral Hallifax, 57, was retired from the naval service in 1935 and had been living at Capetown. The son of an admiral, he formerly served as director of the signal division of the admiralty, commander of the China squadron and the battleship Malaya and was naval attaché to Paris from 1928 to 1931.

WHEELER CRUSADE

WASHINGTON, March 28 (AP)—Senator Wheeler (D-Mont.) announced today that he would start his "crusade against war" next week with a swing through the midwest. All the addresses will be sponsored by the America first committee.

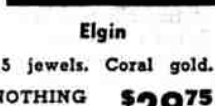
