## Posts Available For CCC Enrollees In Maritime Service

Opening for approximately 35 CCC enrollees from the 29 Oregon and three Washington camps in the Vancouver barracks district exist with the U. S. Maritime service, according to word

Coincidental with improved weather and consequent logging conditions, the Ivory Pine company's sawmill Wednesday will begin operation. Jack Almeter of the Oregon state employment service said Tuesday.

Sheriff Bill Collins said it wouldn't be worth the trouble to have only one prisoner. The woman was requested to return home and come back later.

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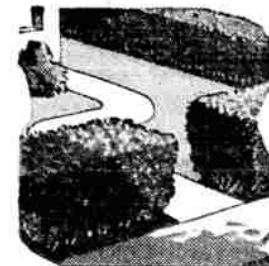
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**REMODELING:** Any structural change may be made, such as putting up or removing partitions, building additions, making "new" rooms out of unused attic or basement space, building porches, sunparlors, etc. One type of building may also be converted into another type. For example, a single-family house could be converted into apartments.



**REPAIRS:** Including carpentry, roofing, masonry, electrical and plumbing repairs, etc..



**REDECORATING:** Floors, walls, and woodwork can be refinished with linoleum (cemented), paint, plaster, wallpaper, etc. New wood floors can be laid.

**MODERNIZING:** Cabinets, shelves, and other conveniences can be built in. New plumbing, heating, and wiring systems may be installed, or old ones modernized. Septic tanks, cesspools, wells, together with pumping equipment, etc., are also eligible.

**LANDSCAPING:** The ground on which the building stands may be improved by grading, laying walks, building fences, and planting.

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
