SPRAGUE PUTS VETO ON FOUR OREGON BILLS

SALEM, April 3 (AP) — Four bills, including the measure to permit sale of natural wines over the bar, were vetoed by Governor Charles A. Sprague today, leaving only 13 bills to be acted upon before next Tuesday's deadline.

The governor explained in his veto message that the people were satisfied with the liquor laws as they now stand, and that sale of wine over the bar would be a "menace to public morals."

He also vetoed a bill to create a nine-member commission which would advertise Oregon dairy products through a compulsory tax on dairymen. The governor said this tax would be "too arbitrary."

Other bills vetoed today would have increased the cosmetic therapy board from three to five members, and would have appropriated \$5000 for Elizabeth E. Brown, injured two years ago in a fall at the state tuberculosis hospital.

Bills increasing penalties for sabotage, requiring elections when school district boundaries are changed, and appropriating \$25 for construction of a fence around the bronze state seal in the floor of the capitol rotunda were vetoed late yesterday.

He signed bills to prevent persons who favor overthrow of the government by force from seeking public office, and to appropriate \$15,000 for education of handicapped children.

There already are adequate state and federal sabotage laws, the governor said, and the result of the vetoed measure would have been "wholesale arrests of many innocent persons."

A fence around the seal, he wrote, would be unsightly, and he added that the secretary of state would place a sign in the rotunda asking people not to walk on the seal.

STAFF ASSISTANCE COURSE TO START

The American Legion auxiliary at its regular meeting which was held Tuesday evening, April 1, signed up members to take an American Red Cross staff assistance course, according to Mrs. Paul Otterbein, social service chairman for the auxiliary.

The staff assistance course consists of a 22-hour lecture course which will be given by Mrs. Howard Boyd, executive secretary, assisted by the various service chairmen of the board of the Klamath county chapter, American Red Cross.

The enrollees, upon the completion of this course, will be fitted to assist the local chapter in its programs such as home service, first aid, water safety, Junior Red Cross, home nursing, clerical work and disaster preparedness. This group will also take charge of registration on the local disaster preparedness committee, and many other duties not specifically included in the other regular branches of volunteer services.

Graduates will receive certificates and will be eligible to wear the staff assistant uniform. This course will be held in the
