not wish to appear "arbitrary" in effecting a temporary solution of the strike.
The union officials, in the presence of the Ford officials, read a letter of reply to him from R. J. Thomas, union president, which said the UAW-CIO accepted the proposal and would recommend its adoption at a meeting tonight of Ford Rouge plant workers.
The letter said in part:
"We have come to the conclusion that your proposal constitutes a constructive basis for termination of the strike and would create for maintenance of stable and equitable labor relations in the plant pending holding of the national labor relations board's election.
"Our decision has been influenced also by the desire of the CIO, the UAW-CIO and the Ford workers to expedite our national defense program.
"We accordingly accept your proposal and will recommend its adoption to a meeting of Rouge workers tonight."
The letter was signed by Thomas, Allan S. Haywood, CIO national organization director, and Michael F. Widman, Jr., director of the UAW-Ford organizing committee.

NAZIS SWEEP MIDLANDS IN AIR ATTACKS

burned out after a shower of incendiary clouds of smoke hung over the center of the city, attracting hundreds of the curious. Fire hose criss-crossed Unter den Linden and the area was roped off.

LONDON, April 10 (AP)—British air raiders dropped "powerful" high explosive bombs in the center of Berlin last night and started large fires, the air ministry announced today.

Overnight attacks also were made on an aluminum plant in German-occupied Norway and a radio station in Denmark, the British declared.

Planes Shot Down
They acknowledged the loss of eight planes in these operations and in daylight assaults yesterday on Brest and other targets, but declared that 11 German bombers were downed in heavy attacks last night on the English midlands and northeast.

It was the first British raid on Berlin since March 23. An informed source said that while the attack was not comparable in size with Monday's night assault on Kiel, "it would have been felt."

Smaller forces of British night raiders were said to have struck at Emden and Vegesack, near Hanover.

The 11 nazi bombers reported shot down in moonlight last night brought to 23 the number destroyed in the last three nights, the British declared.

The British have concentrated east of Bengasi in "an area more adapted to future operations," today's middle east communique said, adding that in a period of several days "we have inflicted considerable casualties on the enemy."

NAIROBI, Kenya Colony, April 10 (AP)—Four thousand Italians and 1000 natives were taken prisoner with the British occupation of Addis Ababa, it was officially announced today.

Dienst Aus Deutschland, commentary close to the foreign office, declared "it is self-evident that the rail line on the east coast of Greece will be one of the principal objectives of German bombers."

This line runs from Parnassus, port of Athens, to the northern area where the British-Greek troops are concentrated, and in the German view a few well placed bombs would paralyze this line.

The Yugoslavia of King Peter II and the government of Premier General Dusan Simovic is doomed, Berlin observers said today as the German army continued its lightning-swift smashes in the Balkans.

Today's high command communique, devoted chiefly to a review of Balkan successes previously reported, presented a picture of terrific destruction inflicted by the luftwaffe on Yugoslav communications and air bases.

Italian Contact
The Budapest newspaper, 8 Oras Ujsag (literally "8 O'clock News") said Nazi troops racing across Yugoslavia had established contact with Italian forces in Albania.

Countering an official Greek denial, Hitler's high command still insisted that Greece's "lost army" of the east—trapped by the Germans' lightning thrust down the Vardar river valley to Salonika—was capitulating.

"Completely isolated Greek forces east of the Vardar are surrendering unconditionally," a Nazi communique asserted this morning.

Hard Assignment
German war correspondents said the break through the Greek metaxas line was one of the war's hardest assignments for Nazi Panzer columns.

Stuka dive-bombers attacking for six hours, as well as artillery, played an important role, they said, but the decisive break came when flame throwers, grenadiers and infantry stormed Greek defense bunkers.

was well prepared to meet the requirements of the peacetime defense program. The national "power pool," he said, has an available capacity of more than 40,000,000 kilowatts, with an additional 7,000,000-kilowatt capacity under contract in new plants.

Facilities vulnerable to wartime sabotage, he said, would include unattended substations, transmission lines, main distribution stations and underground systems that can not be protected as effectively without prohibitive costs as fenced, guarded main power stations and larger substations.
