

LOANS BY KPCA SHOW INCREASE IN 1ST QUARTER

Farmers and stockmen borrowed \$28,585 more from the Klamath Production Credit Association of Klamath Falls during the first quarter of 1941 than during the same period last year, according to Lee S. McMullen, Klamath Falls, secretary-treasurer of the association.

Loans during January, February and March this year totaled \$552,345 compared with \$523,779 last year. The increase in the amount loaned reflects both a larger number of loans made this year than during the same period last year; and also the commencement of farm work earlier than usual by reason of open weather conditions.

The increase is general throughout both the northwest and the nation, McMullen said. The seven Production Credit Associations in Oregon show a \$216,922 increase over loans for January and February, 1940; the four Pacific northwest states show a \$1,136,135 gain for the same period, while nationally the gain for 1941 Production Credit associations in the first two months of the year was \$15,000,000.

On February 28, there were \$4,958,110 of production credit funds outstanding in Oregon. These loans are being made for all types of farm and ranch expenditures, and are repaid as member-borrowers sell their crops, livestock or livestock products.

235-Pounder Must Lose Avoirdupois To Fit Uniform

De Raphael will be battling against statistical odds. Howard Hansen, CCC selecting agent, says records show the average enrollee gains from 10 to 25 pounds during the first few months of service.

SON BLAMED FOR KILLING MOTHER

SEATTLE, April 11 (P)—Detective Capt. Marshall Scrafford said today Ray Terrance Lamb, 23, apparently killed his mother last Monday during despondency over her strange infatuation for a famous Canadian RAF flier now in Africa, and then took his own life.

The dagger wound which caused her death, the detective said, was one she could not have inflicted herself but the young man's wound was plainly self-inflicted. The bodies of the two were found in the bathroom of their home yesterday, 43, fully clothed, in a partly filled bathtub. The son's body was partly disrobed.

"We know the son was greatly concerned about his mother last Saturday night, when he accompanied her on a visit to friends," Captain Scrafford said. "Mrs. Lamb, at that time, was in a near hysterical condition. She seemed to be brooding over the safety of the flier, whom she knew years ago in Canada."

The detective also said he had learned that the son had previously threatened his mother, once saying he would "bump her off" if she did not stop talking and writing to the flier.

Mrs. Lamb's husband, an inventor, was in Chicago at the time of the tragedy but was on his way home today, his employer, C. M. Ambrose, a pole and piling company broker, said. He had been in Chicago about five months.

Notes left by Mrs. Lamb indicated clearly she had contemplated suicide, Captain Scrafford said, but after careful investigation he concluded the son had killed her, in anger, when he found them. She apparently was about to take a bath at the time.

A telegram was delivered to the Lamb home today from Mrs. Lamb's brother in New Westminster, B. C., saying he would arrive this afternoon.
