

REPORT TELLS INCREASE IN SCOUT GROUP

Showing the sizable interest and increase in Girl Scouting in the Klamath area, and the program of service as planned by national headquarters, the following report of the organization committee of the Girl Scout council, from April 18, 1940 to April 17, 1941, has been submitted:

The organization committee continued the same outline used the previous year, namely: A definite assignment of troops to each member of the committee. This not only familiarizes the committee member with her troops but it also makes it possible for the leader to call upon this certain committee member when her assistance is needed.

The ideals and objectives of the Girl Scout program are the same for girls of all ages. However, the program recognizes the varying interests of girls of different ages, and is therefore planned for the three age levels: One for Brownies, or girls from seven to 10 years old; one for Girl Scouts from 10 to 14; and one for Senior Girl Scouts from 14 to 18.

In April, 1940, we had nine intermediate Girl Scout troops, seven Brownie troops and one Marine troop, a total of 285 Girl Scouts. Today, one year later, we have ten and one half intermediate Girl Scout troops, nine Brownie troops, two more in the process of being organized, and two and one-half senior troops, a total of 402 Girl Scouts—an increase of over 50 per cent for the year.

We have 102 registered Girl Scout workers, including the Girl Scout council, leaders, assistant leaders and committees.

Most leaders have had excellent support and cooperation from their troop committees. The big question coming from our scout troops today is, "What can we do to help?" The following is from our Girl Scout Service bureau: "Scouting was founded on the principle of service—duty to God and country, help to others at all times. In the 28 years of our history as an organization, we have been preparing girls to understand the responsibilities that go with their rights in a democracy and to be of service in their communities and in the world, and we have encouraged and fostered attitudes and skills that are particularly useful in these grave times." We must now in practical ways prove our usefulness by "Service in our homes and in our communities."

Federal Mediation Asked in Columbia Mill Wage Dispute

PORTLAND, Ore., May 1 (AP)—Deadlocked CIO lumber workers and employers of the Columbia river basin asked federal mediation yesterday.

They appealed to John R. Steelman of the labor department's conciliation service to appoint a chairman for a meeting here. They are trying to settle a disagreement arising from an International Woodworkers of America demand for a 15-cent-an-hour wage increase.

Representatives of the district's 4000 CIO loggers, who have voted strike authority, said they would await arrival of the mediator before meeting with employers again.

Officials of 5000 sawmill workers, who also voted strike authority, opened separate negotiations with employers today.

Oregon Asked to Aid Army Fund

PORTLAND, May 1 (AP)—Oregon will be called upon to support a nationwide campaign to provide healthful recreation and entertainment for the US armed forces, Frank J. Lonergan said yesterday.

At a Washington, D. C., conference, Oregon's quota in the campaign was set at \$76,500, the state representative told the Multnomah County Republican club.

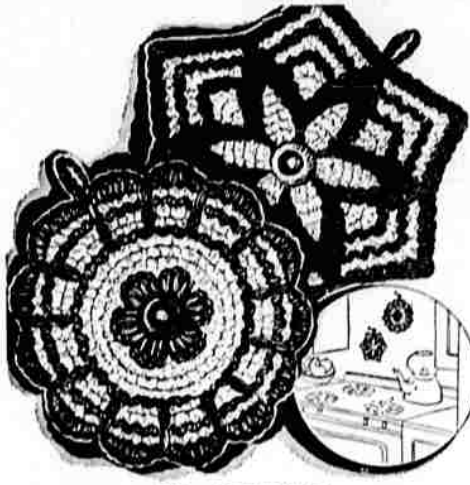

MRS. ROOSEVELT CRITICIZES LINDY

EUGENE, May 1 (AP)—Charles A. Lindbergh was criticized by Mrs. Franklin D. Roosevelt here last night for keeping a

medal from the German government. "If I had received a medal from Hitler, as Lindbergh did, I would have returned it long ago. Of course, what Lindbergh does with his medal is his affair," she told newsmen.

Mrs. Roosevelt also defended the president's comparison of Lindbergh to Civil war "copperheads." "When someone says that the

democracies cannot possibly win this war, anyone has a perfect right to compare that person with certain factions in American history," she remarked.

Three thousand persons heard Mrs. Roosevelt urge closer cultural relations with South America in her first public address in Oregon.

She said a greater knowledge of Spanish and a larger exchange of students would aid

closer ties between the continents. Improvement in business and political relations will follow if cultural relations become better, she added.

Reporters also were told that it was "highly improbable" a U. S. expeditionary force ever would be sent to Europe. Military difficulties of such an action were pointed out.

Mrs. Roosevelt left this morning for Portland, where she is to speak tonight.
