SEAPOW OF BRITAIN MUST HOLD, CLAIM

WASHINGTON, May 8 (UP) Secretary of the Navy Frank Knox said last night that "all the great resources of this nation," including manpower, are committed "to one supreme purpose—to see that British seapower shall not be destroyed."

He said that if Britain should be defeated the United States would face in the Atlantic the victorious navies of "Germany, Italy and France."

The secretary spoke extemporaneously before the annual banquet of the annual convention of the American Booksellers' association. Another speaker was British Ambassador Lord Halifax.

War Jitters

The speeches climaxed a day in which the convoy issue exploded in congress again and a war-jittery capital awaited President Roosevelt's next move in the "battle of the Atlantic."

Knox said that for many years "we had what we are now spending millions to create—a two ocean navy." He explained that one of them was the friendly British navy which has served as this country's guardian in the Atlantic. The U. S. navy, he added, stood guard in the Pacific.

Now, he continued, one of those navies "is in deadly peril" and the danger directly affects "every one of you."

"That is why all the great sources of this nation—finance and industry, trade and commerce, manpower and production, are all committed to one supreme purpose—to see that British seapower shall not be destroyed by a power that openly admits..."

His last words were drowned out by applause.

Open Enemy

Later, however, a United Press stenographic transcript showed that his exact words

U. S. PURSUES FIFTH COLUMN

WASHINGTON, May 8 (UP) The United States moved swiftly yesterday to forestall a "non-military invasion" by fifth column agents masquerading as tourists, refugees and seamen—the secret weapon that has hastened the downfall of many European nations.

Action came on these fronts:

1—The immigration and naturalization service, on direct orders of Attorney General Robert H. Jackson, began a nationwide roundup of German seamen at dawn. By midday, 160 had been seized in seven states.

2—Jackson ordered Manfred Zapp and Gunther Tonn, German newspapermen, arrested and held without bail at Ellis island immigration station for deportation. They previously had been indicted by a District of Columbia grand jury on charges of failing to register with the

state department as foreign agents. Jackson's action was based on grounds that Zapp and Tonn, who were connected with the Transocean news service—German agency—no longer had the status under which they entered this country under a U. S. German commerce treaty.

3—Jackson clamped more rigid regulations on admission and deportation of alien seamen.

4—The house appropriations committee approved a \$241,000 fund to enable the state department to set up a centralized control over issuance of visas to aliens. The committee acted after Assistant Secretary of State Breckinridge Long reported that the state department had information "regarding the known activities of certain foreign governments in endeavoring to introduce agents into the United States in the guise of visitors, immigrants or seamen."

"Great Danger"

Shortly after the seamen had been rounded up, Jackson told the American Judicature society the totalitarian form of "non-military invasion" is the "greatest danger to American freedom." He urged enactment of pending legislation to permit federal agents to tap wires of spies and saboteurs, asserting "the wires of America today are a protected communications system for the enemies of America."

Arrests of the German seamen was made on grounds they had overstayed their 60-day leaves in this country. The sailors, former crew members of Standard Oil

Portland Company's Ships to Be Put On Red Sea Route

PORTLAND, Ore., May 8 (AP) States Steamship company officials said yesterday that three ships operated by them would carry cargoes to the Red sea for use by the British.

The ships under control of the Portland company are the Vermont, Texas and Illinois.

A fourth, the Astoria-owned cannery steamer, William L. Thompson, has been chartered at rates which waterfront observers said were so high that use in lucrative off-shore trade was indicated. However, company officials made no mention of it as a possibility for Red sea trade.
