

TIMBERMEN TO TALK FORESTRY METHODS HERE

At least 100 men, interested in forestry problems, will meet in Klamath Falls Friday at 2 p. m. at the Willard hotel. The session is under the direction of the Society of American Foresters, Columbia River section, in conjunction with the Oregon Forest Practice committee of the Western Pine association.

General topic for discussion will be, "Sustained Forest Production in the Klamath Region." Chairman is F. P. Keen, forest entomologist, bureau of entomology and plant quarantine with headquarters in Portland.

Experts will discuss the present foresting inventory, drain on forests from the three angles, production, pine beetles, and fire, and growth possibilities. The work of various agencies now being done to sustain production, and what more will be done, will come before the body.

Speakers will include members of the Pacific Northwest Forest experiment station in Portland, Lyle Watts, regional forester with the US forest service; State Forester Nelson Rogers of Salem; George Kephart, forest supervisor of the Klamath Indian reservation; W. O. Harrison, forest supervisor of Fremont National forest, and Tom Carr, forester of the Weyerhaeuser Timber company.

All interested lumbermen are invited to attend.

Frank Jenkins, publisher of The Herald and News, will be the principal speaker at a banquet to be given at the Willard at 6:30 p. m. Friday. On Saturday afternoon a field trip is planned through the Klamath Indian reservation, and through a beetle control salvage cutting east of Bly.

Klamath Printers Vote Against ITU Rejoining AFL

Members of the Klamath Falls local of the International Typographical union voted 20 to 3 against a proposal that the ITU reaffiliate with the American Federation of Labor. The referendum was held Wednesday.

INDIANAPOLIS, May 22 (AP)—Scattered returns today from an International Typographical union referendum were more than 2 to 1 against a proposal to re-affiliate with the American Federation of Labor.

ITU Secretary Woodruff Randolph said, however, that an accurate trend of the vote probably could not be determined "for at least a couple of days."

Some 80,000 members of 450 local unions were asked to vote on the proposal. The AFL suspended the ITU two years ago for non-payment of a special assessment levied in 1937 during a membership drive by the rival CIO.

Among the early returns were Seattle 159 for, 252 against; Portland 105 for, 217 against.

AFL Resolution Hits California Fruit Products

A resolution asking Klamath Falls merchants not to buy California Sunkist products was passed at last Sunday's meeting of the district council of the AFL Lumber and Sawmill Workers union, it was announced Thursday.

Over 600 workers in the California fruit orchards have been on strike for six weeks for a living wage, an AFL spokesman said. It was understood AFL headquarters have been feeding and housing the strikers who were reported to have been receiving between 10 and 15 cents per hour for their work while employed.

WESTON, May 22 (AP)—Heavy rains and snow flurries behind them, pea growers hastened today to plant an additional 500 acres. They feared the late planting and moisture would make weeds unusually prevalent.

BAYOCLEAN, May 22 (AP)—Beach residents said today that last week's storm at sea was unusually severe. Deep-sea refuse of all kinds and living organisms of small varieties were washed ashore.

SCIO, May 22 (AP)—The Scio Fruit Growers' association announced yesterday that the receiving station at the Morrison warehouse was being made ready for the annual crop of fruits and berries. Delivery of strawberries will begin this week.

MEDFORD, May 22 (AP)—Seventy-five per cent of the Rogue river valley tomato crop has been planted and the remainder will be in the ground this week. A light frost Monday did not cause commercial loss.

WESTON, May 22 (AP)—Thieves with a liking for C. E. DuPuis store broke into it this week for the second time in '41, taking \$100 worth of miscellaneous goods.

BEND, May 22 (AP)—Base pay increases of \$120 per year have been granted teachers in Bend high school and grade schools. The grade school scale now is \$1200 to \$1600 annually. In the high school the new scale will be \$1320 to \$1800.

MARSHFIELD, May 22 (AP)—Marshfield's tempest over proposed installation of parking meters caused Mayor Albert Mattson to call a conference between council members and retailers for Friday night. Business men have threatened to invoke a referendum and call a special election to settle the issue.

ASTORIA, May 22 (AP)—Revival of flour shipments to China featured April traffic over Astoria port terminals. Flour movements increased from 245 tons in March to 5478 tons in April. Total exports were 9715 tons and imports 4781 tons, both higher than March this year or April, 1940.
