

UNIONS REJECT TRUCE SCHEME IN FIR STRIKE

OLYMPIA, May 27 (AP)—Striking CIO unions in the Pacific northwest lumber and logging industry turned down a defense mediation board's proposal yesterday for full resumption of work pending settlement of the various two-week-old walkouts.

The board recommended that operations be resumed pending a study of the situation by a commission which would then attempt a settlement. O. M. Olson, president of the International Woodworkers of America, said representatives at yesterday's conference flatly turned down the proposals which had been made at a meeting in Washington, D. C., recently with union leaders.

The board said the strike involved 12,000 workers in an industry employing 60,000 to 75,000. There are strikes in progress against 52 Puget sound operations.

The union demands include a full union shop, a flat wage increase of 7 1/2 cents an hour to a minimum of 75 cents, a week's vacation with pay for full year employees, and the elimination of piece work.

Operators countered with these offers:

A union "maintenance of membership agreement" for all employees now members of the IWA, and an agreement to recommend membership to all new employees; a wage increase of 7 1/2 cents on the basic wage with certain variations in the brackets which had a 5 per cent increase in wages last fall and an adjustment to make a 12 1/2 per cent increase for all workers over the scale of last September.

Employers also asked continuance of piece work with the suggestion that a study be instituted of the relation between it and safety standards; one week's vacation with pay for sawmill employees of a full year who have worked 1400 hours of straight time, and a vacation allowance of 2 cents for each hour worked by logging employees.

The board proposed the industry-wide survey to clear up wide discrepancies on reports it received.

"The fir industry is of great importance to our national defense and any stoppage of work will have an effect upon other defense industries within a few weeks," the board said.

Another northwest lumber dispute, involving the Columbia river area, is posted to go before the board later this week.

Japan Declares Navy Ready for Any Eventuality

TOKYO, May 27 (AP)—In a statement made on the eve of President Roosevelt's broadcast tonight Captain Hideo Hiraide, navy ministry spokesman, declared "The imperial navy is always prepared to meet any eventuality."

Two hundred warships are now engaged in patrol duty along

the China coast with more than 300 additional warships together with a total of 4000 planes stationed in the Pacific ready to take action at a moment's notice to defend Japan against any enemy or combination of enemies," the statement continued. Hiraide, in a strikingly frank interview with the Japanese press, said "The United States is now preparing to send warships to convoy merchant ships, so naturally the risks of entering the war with action by Japan should this occur is clearly defined in the tripartite pact."

Japan's interest in the Pacific chat is without a parallel in recent months.

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
