

BRITAIN NEEDS SWIFT STROKE TO STOP NAZIS

Britain must be praying for an Allenby. More than at any time in this war she needs a man of the measure of the conqueror of Jerusalem and Damascus, to deliver the swift and decisive stroke in the Near East which will preserve Turkey as an ally, save the Mediterranean and give heart to the people at home and the friends in the new world.

Perhaps General Sir Henry Maitland Wilson, the general officer commanding in Palestine and Transjordan, is the Allenby of 1941. Upon Wilson will fall the weight of the strategy and the battle, if Britain decides to move her armies into Syria.

There is no evidence that Britain has made that decision. The order issued today, proclaiming Syria and Lebanon enemy-occupied territory for purposes of blockade, is a formality which recognizes officially the German infiltration of the French mandate, an infiltration which is said now to amount to a division of 15,000 men. This same measure was applied successively to Rumania, Bulgaria and Hungary, although not as quickly as to Syria.

British bombing of oil facilities in Beirut extends a British policy already laid down by Foreign Secretary Anthony Eden: to seek out and attack the Germans in any French territory, so long as the French continue to collaborate with Hitler. The bombing does take an added point, however, because Syria is cut off from the Iraq pipeline and the British, by reoccupation of the Mosul area, now are, presumably, in a position to restore the flow of oil to their own depots at Haifa.

Yet the big step, the big risk—a land campaign by the British and Free French against the Germans in Syria and those of the Vichy French army whom the Germans can get to fight—is yet to be taken.

Turkey, for one, seems eager to have the British move into Syria. Today's descendants of the Spaniards and the Janissaries appear willing to risk what almost is a certainty: that if the British conquer Syria, the Germans will plunge into Turkey from the north with the overwhelming might of panzers and dive bombers.

The Turks know that if the Germans consolidate their position in Syria to the extent that they can drive into Iraq and Palestine, Turkey will have to capitulate to the axis and to German occupation. But no one can say now, for sure, that the Turks will fall to fight on the Dardanelles and Bosphorus if a strong British ally is established on the Syrian border.

The news from Ankara today, indeed, is heartening for Britain, for the Turkish foreign minister has told Germany's envoy, Franz von Papen, that Turkey is worried over the arrival of German troops in Syria and that Turkey is taking measures of military security along her Syrian border.

Skilled Workers May Be Released From Army Duty

WASHINGTON, June 6 (AP)—The war department announced Thursday that soldiers needed because of their special skills in defense industries hereafter may be released from military service to return to civilian employment.

This constituted an entirely new policy for the military establishment, and apparently was designed to meet the complaints of many industrialists that even though a labor shortage was developing in many categories of skilled workers men qualified in those skills were being drafted into the army.

The release policy applies to enlisted men of the regular army, to selective service trainees and to national guard members in federal service.

Requests for releases must come from former employers. Releases will be made on an individual basis and under the direction of Undersecretary Robert P. Patterson. The decision, it was said, will be made entirely according to the need industry has for the man and his ability to perform the civilian job.
