

Iced Beverages Will Help Beat The Heat As Summer Arrives



Coffee, sugar, mint, ice... perfect hot weather cooler.

Iced coffee and iced tea season is here. Fruit beverages become popular, too, with hot weather.

To get the best results, make strong hot coffee. Fill tall glasses with ice, place a silver spoon in each glass, and pour hot fresh coffee over the ice. Another method is to make very strong coffee. Pour at once into glass container, cover, cool, and place in refrigerator to

chill. Serve with cracked ice. Keep covered, and make only with freshly brewed coffee.

Follow these same rules for iced tea. Always use very strong tea or coffee for iced drinks.

Iced Coffee Julep
(Makes 6 Servings)
Twelve sprigs fresh mint, 4 tablespoons sugar, 4 cups extra-strength freshly-made coffee, finely crushed ice.

Crush 6 sprigs of mint, add

sugar and coffee and stir until sugar is dissolved. Chill. Fill 6 tall glasses with crushed ice. Pour the chilled coffee over the ice and garnish with a sprig of mint.

To frost the glasses, dip edges in egg white, then in powdered sugar.

For a wedding party or a porch picnic in June, this grape juice punch is a good choice.

Grape Juice Punch
(Makes 12 glasses)

Two cups grape juice, 2 cups sweet cider, 1 cup fresh grapefruit juice, 1 orange, sliced thin, 1 cup granulated sugar, 1 teaspoon nutmeg, 2 quarts charged water.

Combine juices, spices and sugar. Cover and stand 3 hours in refrigerator, stirring occasionally. Place large block of ice in punch bowl. Pour in juices and add charged water.

Grapefruit and orange juice with fresh mint make a refreshing and nutritious drink which most Americans like. To give it a party appearance, garnish with fresh mint and add a little charged water. Fresh strawberries garnish any cold drink beautifully. Tall glasses of 2/3 tomato juice and 1/3 grapefruit juice make the perfect "cooler." Canned pineapple juice with fresh lime juice and thin slices of lemon and sprigs of fresh mint make another vitamin-filled thirst quencher.

Prices Increase As Food Supplies Sent to Britain

If we expect the British to win, we must send them food as well as airplanes. They need pork and lard, certain dairy products, such as cheese and dry skim milk and eggs. Also, canned tomatoes and juice.

Government experts have figured that the food requirements from us for the democracies in the next 15 months will be about 3 or 4 per cent of our own food requirements. That's one reason food prices are rising. Food prices are affected also by the fact that more persons are now working and have more money to spend for food.

In other words, we need to produce more food in the United States, if food prices are to remain at reasonable levels. Can we do it?

Must Make Changes
We cannot raise more hogs this year, but we can feed the hogs we have more corn and get more pork per hog as a result. That means fatter bacon and larger pork chops. But the American housewives like lean bacon and small pork chops.

What's the answer? The answer is a simple one that must be faced. We'll have to change our eating habits. The American housewives will be the leaders in this great change in national menus. We must do it to win this war and to keep our national nutrition high. National defense is more important than personal tastes.

With higher food prices, lower income groups should take advantage of every chance to get cheaper (but not poorer) food for their families. The "penny

milk" plan, for example, should have the backing of every home maker.

Only children can today buy a half-pint of milk for a penny. And only in certain cities. But in New York some 232,000 children and in Chicago another 52,000 are adding to their strength and vitamins by buying every school day at this bargain price.

It is possible because farmers, dairies, school authorities and the federal government are all working together. Farmers accept a slightly lower price for the milk that goes into the "penny milk" bottles. Dairies are expected to handle the business at cost.

It is probable that a half-dozen other cities will soon be starting a similar service for children. Is your city one of them? ARGENTINA SWINGS TO DEFENSE BLOC

BUENOS AIRES, June 6 (AP)—Argentina apparently abandoned today her lukewarm attitude toward intercontinental defense by inviting military leaders of seven American nations, including the United States, to tour her defense establishments.

Brazil, Paraguay, Uruguay, Bolivia, Chile, Peru and the United States were asked to send delegations, headed if possible by war ministers, to this country July 9 when Argentina celebrates her 125th anniversary of independence from Spain.

It would be the first time since 1936, when the Inter-American peace conference proposed by President Roosevelt was held here, that so many high-ranking leaders of the western hemisphere gathered in Argentina.

It was considered significant that the delegations would be welcomed by Enrique Ruiz Guinazu, Argentina's new foreign minister. When he was handed his portfolio there was considerable speculation on what course he would take. The Argentine invitations followed Ruiz Guinazu's return from a visit to Washington, D. C.

Argentina has been the only American nation standing aloof from joint hemispheric action.

'Credit Card' Argosy Inspired By Berry Men

PORTLAND, June 6 (AP)—The Oregon state employment service today described the migration north from California of some 3000 strawberry pickers as a "credit card" argosy.

Director L. C. Stoll said that two berry processors, perceiving a picker shortage, obtained sheaves of gasoline credit cards from oil companies, sent agents among the migratory work camps in California and placed the cards with likely-looking pickers who lacked funds for the trip north.

Cost of gasoline and oil ultimately will be charged against the earnings of the pickers. Stoll said that "all concerned were well pleased with the plan."

Army Bombers Land On Northern Ice

POINT BARROW, Alaska, June 6 (AP)—Two army bombers came down yesterday on an Arctic Ocean ice field in what was believed here to be the northernmost landing ever made by United States military planes.

The Douglas medium bombers taxied down on a level stretch of ice which had been marked off seven miles north of this most northern tip of American territory.

The planes, from the Anchorage army air base under Major W. O. Erickson, are on an ice patrol trip for the coast guard and brought a new radio man for the Point Barrow station.

SALES CONTINUE AT NEAR RECORD

NEW YORK, June 6 (AP)—Retail trade this week continued at a volume close to the near-record levels of previous weeks, the Dun & Bradstreet weekly business survey reported today.

"In many centers," said the review, "the rush to buy automobiles, electrical appliances and other home furnishings was at a pace unequalled in history. Sales comparisons with dollar trade volume in 1940 held to a margin of 16 to 20 per cent, although the sales curve at this time a year ago was beginning to point upward after a slump during day."

"Gains widened somewhat in the southern area where the increase over last year was estimated at 18 to 24 per cent for the south and 14 to 25 for the southwest. New England again scored one of the best comparisons, with an average increase of 20 to 23 per cent."

"East and middle west were above the year-ago level by 15 to 20 per cent, northwest by 12 to 16 per cent and Pacific coast by 17 to 23 per cent."

FISHING IMPROVES IN LAKE COUNTY

Reports from Fremont national forest offices at Lakeview, prepared before the mid-week rains began, show that fishing conditions in a number of creeks in that area are showing improvement.

Dairy, Deep, Mud, Blue and Elder creeks were reported as "fair" for fishing, as were the Sprague, Chewaucan and Sycan rivers. Buck and Silver creeks were reported poor for fishing.

Most roads were reported passable but rough and the Dairy creek district was described as "quite wet."

Streams were reported as going down but still high in some places.

Louis Chevrolet, Pioneer Motorcar Designer, Dies

DETROIT, June 6 (AP)—Louis Chevrolet, 62, pioneer motorcar designer and in his earlier days one of the greatest of all racing automobile drivers, died at his home here today. He had been in poor health for several years and in retirement for nearly a decade. He is survived by his widow and one son.

Chevrolet was born in Switzerland, on December 25, 1878. On May 20, 1905, he drove a Fiat racing automobile over a measured mile at Sheep Head bay, New York, in 52.8 seconds for a new world's record.

He regarded it as his greatest achievement, however, the designing and building of two consecutive Indianapolis speedway winners—in 1920 and 1921—the first driven by Chevrolet's brother, Gaston, and the second by Tommy Milton.

Gaston Chevrolet was killed at the Los Angeles speedway in a collision late in 1920.

Louis Chevrolet built the first Chevrolet automobile in 1911 in cooperation with William C. Durant. The Chevrolet company became part of General Motors corporation in 1915. Prior to his retirement Chevrolet was associated with the Stutz Automobile company in Indianapolis.

Burial will be in Indianapolis Tuesday.

Barbara Bennett on Way to Mexico for Second Marriage

HOLLYWOOD, June 6 (AP)—Barbara Bennett of the altar-visiting Richard Bennett family is en route to Mexico to wed Addison (Jack) Randall, Western film star, only three days after being freed from Morton Downey.

Miss Bennett said she and Cowboy Jack would be married "as soon as we reach Mexico" but did not say at what town. They left last night.

Downey, to whom Barbara was married 11 years ago and who failed in repeated attempts at a reconciliation last winter, divorced Miss Bennett in Connecticut the first of the week. He was awarded custody of their five children.

Barbara's marriage to Randall will be her second. Sister Constance has been married four times; sister Joan twice and father Richard twice.
